Announcing five card suit in bid

Most bridge players today use a system of thought called five card majors. This system, simply put; means that any time one opens the bidding with one of a major suit, he announces opening values and a five card suit.

In the event that one has an opening hand but no five card major, he bids one of his better minor. The partnership understanding is that when partner opens one of a minor, the bid

THE ANALYSIS:

Even the most avid proponents of 5-card majors should consider opening the East hand with 1-Sinstead of 1-D for several reasons: I. East wants a spade lead if

more easily should partner respond 2 clubs. 3. East's concentration of high

cards is immediately defined.
As the cards lie, 3 NT, which is not a good contract, can be made but few pairs will get this high except by sheer momentum. E-W are more likely to play a diamond, spade, or notrump partial. The distribution is so favorable for E-W that East, as declarer, can actually take 10 tricks in elther spades or notrump with double-dummy play against

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
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
