Hardball lights impossible

Representatives from the Georgetown Baseball Association (GBA) Pat Burroughs, Dan Guistini, Colin Brookes and Finn Poustrup talked with the Recreation Director of Halton Hills Tom Shepard for an hour recently in a meeting to ask for hardball lights.

The verdict stands that the Recreation Department can't put up the hardball lights required for a Junior Ball club which has been entered for the 1982 season.

However, the Recreation department did commit themselves to erect softball lights on the Georgetown Armories. The lights will be on 75 ft. standards instead of the regular 45 ft. standards usually required for softball lighting.

The extra height for the lighting will enable the

diamond to be used for hardball up to the bantam house league age level. GBA executive member, Finn Poustrup said.

Meanwhile, Poustrup, who is president of the newly formed Eagles hardball team which will be starting their first season in the spring, says their 50-50 draw was extremely successful.

Cosch Kevin Burke sold almost half of the tickets for the draw and he deserves a lot of the credit for the success of the draw, Poustrup said.

"He (Kevin Burke) made it all happen. He deserves more credit for the job he's done for the team," Poustrup said.

Considering the number of younger team members who are coming out for the first time, coach Bob McKay and Ray Smith were pleased with the outcome of the meet. In addition to the talent in the group, the coaches are pleased with their enthusiasm.

Mike Del Giudice came first in the 87 lb division while teammate Jeff Knight was second and Gord Sauvage fourth in that weight category.
