

GDHS volleyball team off to good start

Both the senior and junior girls' volleyball teams played exhibition games against Burlington Central resulting in the seniors winning three of four games and the juniors winning two of four. The senior team also were runners-up in the Guelph Collegiate Invitational tournament last weekend.

Linda Baton was considered the best spiker. Carolyn Griffiths was considered the best defensive player of the game.
Coach O'Neill says she was surprised about the quality of the serving and the potential of the team. This is partly due to the height to be found on this year's players.
At the Guelph Invitational the Rebels played five other teams in the round-robin. To Southwood, from Cambridge, they split their two games, both winning and losing one, and won the two games each they played with Glenview, Westdale, Guelph Collegiate and Centennial. This gave them a total of nine wins and one loss.
In the semi-final game against Southwood the Rebels won both their games, with scores of 16-14

and 15-6. In the finals the Rebels lost both their games to Westdale, with scores of 15-7 and 15-12.
Coach Clatworthy gave the reason for the loss as playing twelve straight games without a break prior to the final games, whereas Westdale had a one hour rest.
He noted Kim Thompson as advancing in her skill level and becoming a good spiker. Michelle Miehms did an outstanding job at serving during the tournament by only missing two of approximately 80 serves throughout the day.
The Rebels had a home game yesterday against Perdue.

The GDHS boys' wrestling team placed third, one and one half points out from second, among the best teams in Ontario last weekend at the Bishop Ryan Invitational wrestling meet in Hamilton.

Coach McKay termed the meet a "high-powered" one because of the number of skilled wrestlers, such as three Canadian junior champions and four individual OFSAA champions, in attendance.
Several wrestlers did well throughout the day by placing in the top four in their weight category. In the 84 lbs. division Mike Del-

guidice placed first and Jeff Knight was third.
Bob Sweezie displayed veteran wrestling style in the 119 lbs. category by defeating Tony Stewart seven points to zero. Last year in the OFSAA finals the situation was reversed as Stewart beat Sweezie by a similar decision. In the same division Jim Wittmier placed fourth.

Hon Martin displayed his improved abilities by placing third in the 149 lbs. division, one of the toughest weight categories of the meet. Both the first and second wrestlers of the division were OFSAA finalists last year.
In the 165 lbs. category veteran Mark Roberts placed a strong third. Other rookie wrestlers that participated but did not qualify were Steve Power, Mike

Gobsill, Wayne Morrow, Rich Middaugh, Rich Sedor and Troy Larouche.
Mike Taylor did wrestle in

the 141 lbs. division but did not qualify due to a knee injury soon to be operated on.
