

- refuse (regardless of weight) is delivered by automobile (without trailer).



BRIDGE:

Before reading any further, cover all hands except the west

What do you bid to start the auction? One spade? Two spades? Both are good starts. Suppose your start is one spade. Partner responds 2 hearts (a heart suit and 10-12 points). What now? 3 clubs by you is good for two reasons. Your partner is forced for one more round and you can describe your two-suited hand.

When partner bids 3 diamonds you are elated. Partner is bidding a new suit forcing. Partner must be encouraging. Now what? 4 spades? 5 clubs? Either should get the job done.

If you would have made these bids, you would have scored well last Tuesday at the Georgetown Bridge Club. It is quite difficult to make the necessary inferences about your partner's hand when you can see only your own. Hind-sight is a wanderful thing but it and 50 cents might buy a coffee. It certainly doesn't do one any good when bidding. This was the hand: THE HAND:

Small slam can be made in spades and grand slam in clubs but it's difficult for west to pinpoint the key cards in East's hand. If West opens with a game-forcing two-bid (best), E-W will get to small slam in due course; the pair have a chance to reach 7clubs if West opens I spade and the auction proceeds; W-1S, E-2H, W-3C, E-3D, W-4C, E-6C, W-7C. West's 3-C shows a hand of great strength so East's 3-D is a walting bld, asking West to clarify his hand, and tends to

show a diamond control. When West rebids his clubs, East can infer partner is 6-5 in the black suits 9 (with only 5-5 he should have opened 1-C) and take a shot at slam. From West's point of view, East is marked with a singleton spade and the K-C for his vigorous bidding and should have the

A-D for his 3-diamond bid. Note that once East has made a two-over-one response and West a change of suit at a higher level, a game force exists; both East and West can therefore bld slowly to show all their values.






