As a number of Presbyterian families moved into the community, the Methodist church building was shared with them. The Presbyterians would meet in the morning. while the Methodists met in the afternoon. Although sermons were long, often lasting over an hour, many people attended both services.

OWN CHURCH By 1878, the Presbyterians built their own church, which is the building now known as Ballinafad United.

In 1925, the United Church of Canada was formed, uniting Methodist, Congregational and Presbyterian congregations. It was decided to use the newer and larger Presbyterian building in Ballinafad and close the older Methodist church except for social functions. Much of

the tumber from the old church was recycled when a basement was put under the newer church in 1954. The organ was moved and the pulpit is still used in the basement.
