again," said Hayward, who was in goal when Cornell bested Northen Michigan in the second game of their two-game NCAA series last March.

The experience he has garnered taught Hayward a lesson he hopes his teammates will heed this winter. "Nothing we get will be easy," he noted, "and our degree of success really depends on how hard we work for it."

For Hayward, the hard work that culminates in his stints in the net began last summer. "I had the chance to play a lot of hockey over the summer at home," he commented.

"It helps to keep your mind in the game, and it keeps you in shape."

For a goaltender, keeping his mind in the game is often the key to a consistently good effort. Hayward's mental preparation begins long before he skates over to the

"A few days before the game, I try to meet with the coaches to go over the tendencies of the other team's shooters, and their power play system," Hayward said. "Then, on game day, I spend some

time at home, being quiet if I can, so I can go over all the possible situations I might have to face in the game," he said.

Despite his intense concentration on the game. Hayward says that the crowd does make a difference to him. "Here at home, the crowd is so supportive that you sort of get comfortable with it the minute you step out onto the ice," he said.

"On the road, when we face a hostile crowd, it just gives me more incentive. I figure that if the crowd pays that much attention to me, it's a compliment." DIFFICULTION

Once he gets to the rink, Brian Hayward may have the most difficult job of anyone on the Cornell roster but he handles the pressure well. "I suppose that I am a very fundamental-style goaltender," he stated.

"I don't particularly have a style or any flamboyant habits on the ice, but I try to stick to the basics, and concentrate," Hayward said.

One insight into Brian Hayward's view of hockey epitomizes his style as a fundamental, team player. "When I think about the games I have played in here, I really do not remember them on a save-by-save basis; or anything like that," Hayward said. "Instead, I remember particular games as a whole, and the way the team came on."

Hayward's most memorable game would probably rank up there on the list of many Lynah Rink fans as well: the 1979 victory over Boston University here.

They came in for that game with a very high rating, but we really put it together, and I remember it as probably the most solld 60 minutes of hockey I have played here," said Hayward.

To give the 1982 team solid defensive performances, Hayward will be working with several new defensemen.
