## New social services director part of region's restructuring

Halton region has a new director of social services, nearly completing managerial changes recommended for that department last year following a lengthy consultant's study into the region's administration.

### NOTICE OF CHANGE IN PENALTY TO BE CHARGED ON ARREARS OF TAXES LEVIED IN 1982

The Town has recently been imposing a penalty for late payment of taxes levied in 1981 equal to 22.75% per annum of the amount unpaid on the first day of default and on the first day of each calendar month thereafter. Effective February 1st, 1982 this penalty is being changed to 18% per annum. A penalty of 18% per annum of the amount of all taxes levied in 1982 and unpaid at December 1st, will be added to the unpaid balance on that date.

This straightforward and economical leisure home design is perfectly suited to the narrow lot-size recreational building site yet it contains all the amenities of a well-planned detached house. The on-site design is so simple of construction and economical to build that it lends itself to an extended do-it-yourself project. The horizontal channel siding and shingle roof of the exterior provide a maintenance and modern look which will blend easily with a wide range of natural settings. Simple, paneled shutters add great charm and visual interest to the facade.

The weather-protected main entry leads into a compact reception foyer and entrance storage area, which functions as an energy-conserving vestibule, or "air-lock" in weather extremes. From the vestibule, traffic moves forward directly into the spacious living-dining room. The living room features an energy-efficient zero-clearance fireplace and wide, sliding glass doors providing access to the large sliding patio.

A long, L-shaped kitchen provides generous counter-top work surfaces, a sensible work triangle configuration and standard cupboard storage. A swing door to the side of the kitchen provides a secondary access to the side patio, for ease of supply delivery.

Both bedrooms are positioned to the left of the main living and entertaining areas for freedom from disturbance. Each has ample closet storage and good exposure for view and natural light. A space-saving pocket door further completes the separation between the bedroom area and the living area.

A convenient laundry facility, consisting of stacked washer-dryer, is located immediately adjacent to the three-piece bathroom.

The service care containing the heater and hot water tank is positioned behind lowered bi-fold doors at the rear end of the hall and is easy of access for servicing and maintenance.
