the community and the church, remembers Mrs. Mac-Donald. She and her husband Clarence live next door to the church.

"She was a very gracious lady," Mrs. Anderson said. "And she was a very good cook. She always brought tarts and baking when she visited."

A number of the children's books published by Miss Montgomery were written while the couple lived in Terra Cotta, Mrs. Anderson said.

Involved with her husband's work, Mrs. MacDonald set up a drama club at the church from the Young People's Guild, a project that succeeded so well financially that they were able to provide the school room with electric fixtures and a piano and recover the cushions of the pews in the church auditorium.

It was during Rev. Mac-Donald's ministry that Union Presbyterian celebrated 100 years of service to the commu-

TOTAL COST The 1933 centennial was celebrated by installing electric lights and decorating the church edifice, at a total cost of \$1,689.82. As well, a booklet was published outlining the early history of the congregation, beginning in 1833 when records listed charter

members. Before 1833, there were no public religious services held in the community, with worship being limited to homes of ploneers. Settlers from Ireland, Scotland, England and the U.S. came to the Esquesing and Chinguacousy townships and built their log cabins in what was then forest.

In those days, going to church meant trudging ten or more miles along a forest path to get to what was called Boston Church.

Some of these colonizers were former soldiers in the Peninsular Army of the Duke of Wellington. They migrated to Upper Canada after the Battle of Waterloo.

Apparently there were two local congregations of Presbyterian lineage established originally, one a Free Church and one a Church of Scotland. After a time, a "union" came about between the two groups in the 1830s, giving the present church its name.

FULL-TIME Until a full-time preacher was summoned, students from Knox Presbyterian Seminary in Toronto, who travelled the large Presbylery of Toronto circuit, came out to preach on the Sabbath to the Union

congregation. By 1845, Union was able to call its first minister, the Rev. Patrick Gray, an Irishman who also ministered to the Norval Presbyterian and Boston Church until 1850.


