Fatal mishap trial set Jan. 8

A Georgetown man involved in a fatal traffic accident in Brampton Jan. 8 will stand trial Sept. 8.

Two cars collided at the Queen Street West and Kimbark Drive intersection in Brampton killing a 15-year old Brampton youth and seriously injuring another. Five other youths in the car escaped injury.

Randall Gordon Galbraith of McIntyre Crescent was charged with dangerous driving, impaired driving and having more than .08 per cent alcohol in his blood following the fatal accident.

Mr. Galbraith was uninjured in the collision that caused \$8,000 damage to both cars.

Francophones ready for fete

Thanks to the rather unique community-boosting efforts of the late Therese Ste. Jean and others during the 1950s and '60s, Georgetown has a distinct French-Canadian legacy, and area French-speaking residents associated with Sacre Coeur parish will be promoting better understanding of their culture among fellow citizens of all ethnic backgrounds during French Week March 7 to 13.

Visits by widely-respected French-Canadian entertainers will highlight a busy schedule of activities arranged by Ecole Sacre Coeur's Parent-Teacher Association for the church hall on Guelph Street and at the John Elliott Theatre.

Association spokesman Rosemary Baikin told The Herald that spectators at a series of special presentations should come away with a better understanding of French-Canadian culture itself and a greater appreciation for the scope of culturally-oriented resources and facilities in the Metro Toronto area.

Under the thematic banner "Soyons Fiers D'Etre Francais", French Week begins March 7 with an 11 a.m. mass at Sacre Coeur Church. Workshops will then join other celebrants at Elliott Theatre for the 2 p.m. official opening ceremonies featuring Mayor Pete Fomeroy and other area VIPs.

The formal opening precedes a concert that boasts both the Sacre Coeur school choir and La Rhdane, a French-Canadian folk group. Tickets for the entire afternoon at Elliott Theatre are \$2 for adults and 50 cents for senior citizens and children under 12. Refreshments will be available, and guests can also browse among the information tables being manned in the foyer by representatives of the Red Cross, Heart Fund, Cancer Society and possibly the separate school board and Centre Francophone.

The Theatre du Petit Bonheur takes over the Elliott stage Monday night (Feb. 8) for an 8 p.m. double bill performance. Their presentation of "Jouaille moi d'amour" is a delightful comedy, while "Le Defant" is a drama not recommended for children. Admission is \$2 for adults except seniors, who get in for 50 cents.

Claude Jutra's award-winning dramatic film "Mon Oncle Antoine", depicting life in smalltown Quebec during the mid-1970s, is on the Elliott Theatre screen Wednesday night (March 10) at 8 p.m. The French dialogue film with English subtitles will be followed by an open discussion. In lieu of an admission charge, there will be a silver collection.

At Sacre Coeur Church hall Friday (March 12), the Association presents Case Chantant, a singalong featuring various French-Canadian artists. The evening begins at 8 p.m. and features a draw that will see two lucky ticket holders enjoying a weekend at Toronto's Harbourfront. Tickets are \$8 per couple.

Saturday (March 13) sees a major highlight of French Week when renowned clown-musician Eglantine entertains youngsters (pre-school to Grade 4) in the gallery at the Library-Cultural Centre. Admission is 50 cents.
