Julian worried about Henderson shift

Tory roster holds hope?

While reserving judgement until after Premier Bill Davis' cabinet shuffle has had a chance to work, Halton-Burlington MPP Julian Reed has noted a few apparent bright spots and at least one "disaster" in the Conservative government's new duty roster, unveiled last weekend.

He described the move of Dennis Timbrell from the health ministry to the agriculture portfolio as a creditable one, "despite the fact that Mr. Timbrell doesn't have much manure on his boots".

Mr. Timbrell replaces Lorne Henderson, a hog breeder who as agriculture minister faced growing animosity from fellow farmers charging that the government hasn't come up with solutions to their economic concerns and has barely

demonstrated an appreciable amount of concern for them. Mr. Henderson has assumed the resources secretariat portfolio.

But Mr. Henderson's shift, Mr. Reed claims, is like "moving one disaster to cause another".

"It shows what little importance the province places on resource development," he said. "This is the key to Ontario's economic recovery. Taking Henderson, who was a failure in agriculture, to resource development is not my idea of making progress."

Mr. Reed told The Herald Monday that he sees Heuben Baetz' move from the culture and recreation ministry to the newly-formed ministry of recreation and tourism as a demotion.

The appointment of George Taylor to the cabinet is, as yet, an "unknown quantity", Mr. Reed said. Mr. Taylor, previously a backbencher, will be the province's new solicitor general now that the premier plans to split that office from the auspices of attorney-general Roy McMurtry.

Other appointments announced over the weekend: — Gordon Walker, formerly minister for consumer and commercial relations, to the new industry ministry; former industry and tourism minister Larry Grossman will head the health ministry;

— Robert Elgie to consumer and commercial relations, departing the ministry of labor which he headed for almost four years; Energy minister Robert

Welch, Mr. Reed's counterpart in the legislature, retained his portfolio.

Mr. Reed said he won't be

surprised if the Liberal opposition underwent a full-scale shadow cabinet shuffle after the selection of a new leader.
