thing, they aren't too happy with it."

She said the old building, dating back to 1870, needed a lot of repairs and parking was difficult on Main Street.

Watson Winfield, 78, a former deacon of the church and a member since 1919 when he moved to Georgetown from Essex, said the church shouldn't have been sold.

"You don't get a church built like that for \$8,000 nowadays," he said. The Baptist church on Main Street was built by hand for that sum back in 1870 and opened debt free. The principal contributors were John Bessey, Robert Bessey, J.B. Dayfoot, George Dayfoot and L.W. Goodenow.

This building was followed in 1874 by a parsonage to the west of it. The parsonage has since been torn down to be replaced by a brick apartment building.

Records show the pastor was paid \$8 a week and accommodated in the parsonage for his services back in 1867.

CHURCH PUT

In 1903, on the advice of the finance committee, the church put in a wooden ceiling and electric chandeliers in the church auditorium at a cost of \$190. Three years later they spent the princely sum of \$1,000 toward new seats,



Inside the plain red brick exterior, the Mountainview Baptist Church is rather attractive. With a knotty pine ceiling, the church interior features two lovely stained glass windows at the altar given in memory of Fred Armour Harley and his mother

and father by Mrs. F. Harley in 1922. The windows were taken out of the old Baptist church building on Main Street in 1979 when the downtown congregation moved into new quarters on Mountainview Road.

Here's an impressive one-and-one half story home design which combines a tasteful exterior with a luxuriously-appointed, yet highly practical, interior layout. The plan is perfectly suited to the modern-to-heritage residential building lot and provides in excess of 2,100 square feet of finished floor area, for present use, and makes allowance for a further 500 square feet of available future accommodation. The plan is ideal for the family which prefers one large and open area, or a built-in room could be installed or a snack-bar counter could be added, to divide the kitchen and family room and the two-car garage. The weather-protected, porch-style main entry leads into a spacious entrance foyer and over-weather storage area, from which traffic moves naturally to the right and into the long rectangular living dining room combination. The living room features a raised-hearth masonry fireplace and front-facing French doors which open onto the wide veranda. The dining area has a sliding glass door through which a viewable access to the elevated rear balcony. The dining area separates from the kitchen via convenient pocket door, for privacy and easy separation of formal and informal dining styles.

A well-planned L-shape kitchen-dining and family room combination occupies almost the entire rear half of the lower level floor plan, providing abundant lounge and recreational area for the active family. The kitchen area boasts a step-saving work triangle, generous cupboard storage and abundant countertop work surfaces. A half-wall and optional granite screen separates the dining room from the kitchen. This could easily be omitted, for the family which prefers one large and open area, or a built-in room could be installed or a snack-bar counter could be added, to divide the kitchen and family room and the two-car garage. The laundry area has provision for a side-by-side configuration of washer-dryer, and has abundant built-in storage facilities.

A two-piece vanity bathroom is conveniently located at all lower level areas. All three bedrooms are positioned on the upper level, as is the four-piece master bedroom and the large un-finished basement area. Each of the bedrooms provides generous closet storage and excellent natural light and views. The master bedroom boasts a two-piece ensuite bathroom, with tub and shower, and two vanity sinks, and a full walk-in closet.

The spacious un-finished area could be later completed as an upper-level family room/TV lounge, or as a study, office for the business-minded family, or as a fourth bedroom, in accordance with individual family preferences and space requirements.

A five-set plan package, including the first set, is economically priced at \$108.00 and an eight-set package, also including the first set, is only \$228.00.
