Wrestlers send four to OFSAA

Last Thursday at Bolton a youthful Rebel wrestling team qualified four of their 19 wrestlers to go to the OFSAA championships and placed second in the Halton-Peel wrestling championships.

The Rebel wrestlers accumulated a total of 79 points for a second placing behind Erindale's 103 team points. Central Peel and Nelson placed third and fourth with 56 and 52 points respectively. Erindale was the team

expected to win.

Only the top two wrestlers in each weight division are entitled to compete at the provincial championships, to be held this Friday and Saturday in Windsor. There are four Georgetown qualifiers.

Two of these qualifiers were both in the 84 lbs weight class. They were Mike DelGuidice and Jeff Knight, placing first and second respectively.

Both DelGuidice and Knight ended up wrestling each other in the final bout,

enabling both to go to OFSAA.

Bob Sweeie earned his way to Windsor by defeating rival Rob Hepple four to one in the 119 pound division. Coach McKay considers their bout the best technical match of the day.

Swapping leads at Orangeville Reservoir track

Over 80 competitors raced their studied tired motocrossers and flat trackers round the one-third mile course cleared on the Orangeville Reservoir ice in front of an enthusiastic crowd of approximately 1000 fans last Feb. 4.

Two quick qualifying heats for the 250 juniors preceded the regular program which included Schoolboy, the 125, 250 and open juniors; light-weight and open seniors and experts; the 200 Senior-Expert combined class and the final piece de resistance, the sidecars.

Products sponsored Honda. Mike Doucette of Georgetown again laid waste to the 250 Junior class on his Yamaha. Doucette, a relative newcomer to the flat-track field is travelling with the Cornwell Racing Group and obviously picking up some of their habits. The Open Junior class was taken by Ray Little

of Hannon on a Honda. The makings of some good battles in the expert races failed to materialize when Jon Cornwell grabbed a decisive lead off the start of the 250 race. Some dicing back in the pack between Mark Holliday, Peter Grant and Bob Sobering ended when Grant threw a chain, leaving Holliday

and Sobering to chase Cornwell's quick Suzuki over the finish line a distant second and third.

The open expert final provided more excitement when Cornwell, boxed in at the start, sliced through the pack in corners one and two and settled down to chase Mark Holliday for several laps before finally diving under him in corner three on the 4th lap.

Holliday on his two stroke snapped at Cornwell's heels while fighting off a charge by Chris Evans and in the end it was Cornwell by several lengths followed by Holliday and Evans.

The sidecars continue to astound the crowd and the unbeatable combination of Blake Pierce, John Parker and their following Cycle World sponsored Honda maintained a firm grip on number 1.

A small but enthusiastic schoolboy class buzzed round the course flat out with Mark Davies of Whitty on a Yamaha nailing down first place followed by Steve Robertson and Andrew Cleary both of Ajax in grim pursuit on their Hondas.
