Duplicate bridge

As often happens in any bridge game, a reasonable contract can be made in today's hand by both the North-South pair and the East-West pair. In order for the North-South pair to achieve their contract, they require the machinery of the weak two opener. This understanding allows the South hand to open 2 hearts knowing that his partner (North) understands a point count of 6-12 and at least a 6-card heart suit headed by at least two honours. (This description may be shaded slightly if favourable vulner-

ability prevails). The East-West pair may find their contract when the North-South pair does not open (they may not use the weak two convention). In third seat holding 5 diamonds, East should bid one of that suit. If North passes (he should), East will bid his 4-card heart suit and South will smile slightly and pass quickly. West now should bid his other 4 card suit forcing East to choose. When East chooses diamonds, West will pass and their contract will roll. This was the hand played by the Georgetown Duplicate Bridge Club members last Tuesday. Since most of these avid bridge players use the weak two bid, nine north-south pairs hold some number of a heart partial. Three other times east-west were allowed to find their diamond fit. This was the hand:

If N-S are using weak two blds South will open 2 H after East passes. That should end the auction, as West does not have quite enough for a takeout double. At 2 H, South will usually score 8 tricks and could come out with nine. If South passes initially, West should open 1 D in third seat and East's up the line 1 If response will effectively silence South. West may then become slightly III at the thought of bidding again, but 2 C will elicit 2 D and the bidding will die right there. Careful play (which includes ruffing a club in dummy) will produce 8 tricks, but if North leads a trump and continues trumps when he gets in again to stop the club ruff, declarer will be hard pressed to make his contract. Guessing to lead low to the S Jack and later felling


