2-on-1 break. Just before the buzzer sounded Brampton netted their last goal of the contest.

The only scoring play in the final frame was by Stuart Vogt - his second of the game.

Brampton sported a two man advantage near the end of the game but could not connect.

Chris McCarthy led with three assists and Kevin Roe earned two. Doug McDermott, Alan Gray, and Brent Freshwood drew singles. Sean Cotton and Curtis Green shared goaltending duties and each came up with
