Results from two Canadawide mathematics competitions conducted for secondary schools by the University of Waterloo show both Acton and Georgetown District

High Schools placing well. The results released last week by the university rank GDHS 20th among Ontario secondary schools which participated in the Pascal Fermat contest. AHS' ranking was given only for Zone 73, comprising Peel and Halton schools, in which it placed 38th compared to GDHS' seventh-place finish in Fermat and 38th in Pascal, compared to GDHS' third.

## Jelinek seeks full review of auto woes

Progressive Conservative automotive industry spokesman Otto Jelinek last week called on the government to bring the whole matter of the deteriorating Canadian auto industry to a Standing of unfair and one-sided Committee for a complete and thorough review.

Last week's revelation that neither the Canadian government nor General Motors has a format ironclad contract with the government of Iraq for the sale of 12,500 Malibus, while at the same time allowing the Export Development Corporation to underwrite a policy that has now jeopardized 80 million tax dollars, is the last straw, the Halton MP said.


"It is Irresponsible and quite obviously a bad business practice to jeopardize 80 million tax dollars on a deal about which neither the Minister of State for International Trade nor his cabinet colleagues were certain of the terms," Mr. Jelinck sald.

It is characteristic of the government's handling of the automotive industry that the

revelations should come on the eve of the expiry date of the Japanese auto quota agreement, he noted, leaving Canatla virtually alone in the industrialized world at the mercy Japanese export policles.

"It is becoming increasingly obvious that neither International Trade nor Industry, Trade and Commerce have been able to get a handle on the problems facing this industry," sald Mr. Jelinek.
