

# Jon paces local bikers to indoor ice-racing victory

Over a thousand spectators packed the seats of the Glenbrook arena to watch Ontario's only indoor ice race Sunday, April 18.

Around 60 riders sprinted through the elimination seats battling for the all-important win that guaranteed them a front row start for the final.

Two of Georgetown's riders won their heats. Mike Doucette on his Yamaha grabbed the lead in the tight first corner and held it to the end. Jon Cornwell riding the Len Shepley turned Suzuki also took the lead in the first corner but lost it in a moment of carelessness on the third corner to Todd Sharpless of Don Mills.

He chased Todd for another lap dogging Todd until he could dive under him on the third lap to salvage his front row start. Steve Duff managed to make the final by winning his semi-final and Dave Broomhead also of Georgetown fought his usual bad luck all night making the final by the skin of his teeth.

The finals lined up with Mike Doucette battling it out with Bill Wilson of St. Catharines for the 250 Junior title. Bill out-jockeyed Mike in the first lap and Doucette had to settle for second.

The senior class saw Darryl Johnson dive into the

lead and after some mid pack scrambling Dave Broomhead emerged in second place with Toni Sharpless hot on his heels. Toni managed to pass Dave leaving him in third but a disqualification of Johnson resulted in Toni winning with

Dave second. The expert lineup put Jon Cornwell on the front row with Bob Sobering who was riding the Branford Cycle and Sled water cooled Yamaha and Chris Evans of St. Catharines on a Farmers'

four stroke Honda. Todd Sharpless on his sister's Can-Am made the front row after a win in the semi. Cornwell grabbed the lead after some exciting cross and jostle work in the first corner and then dominated the

balance of the race with Sobering nailing down second place in spite of heavy pressure from Evans, who took third place. The jubilant Cornwell, marking his debut at indoor ice racing with the victory,

roused a roar from the crowd when he asked if they'd had as much fun as he had and did they want to come back next year. Judging by the response the Glenbrook arena had better enlarge their parking lot.

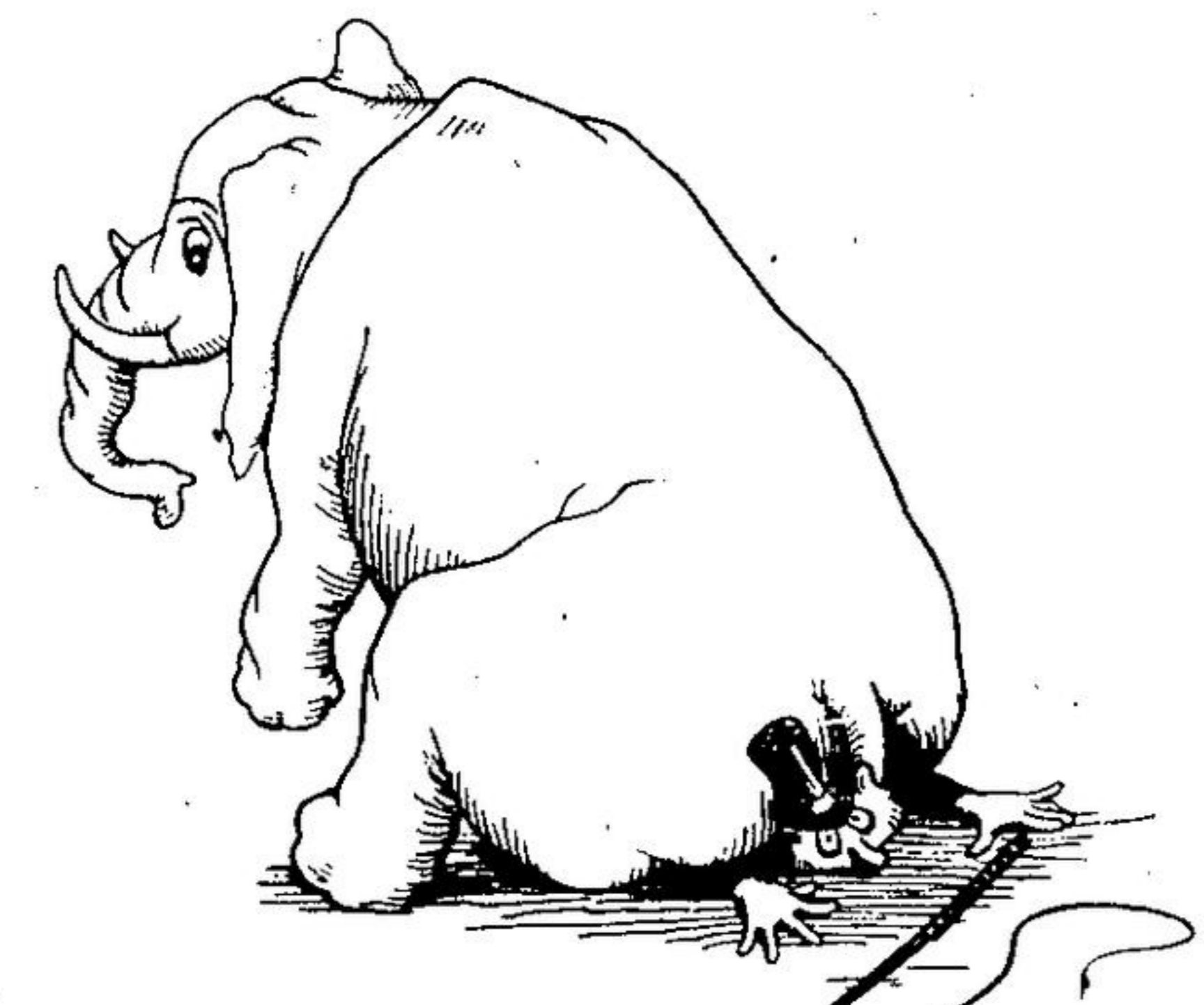
