

# Veteran Minor hockey workhorse Bill Fisher receives new award

As a former Junior B Dixie Bechive hockey player, he found it difficult to adjust at first to teaching the kids to play hockey and have fun, rather than just concentrate on winning.

"As a player you play to win - as a coach you coach to teach and have fun," he says. Facchini moved to Georgetown 12 years ago. He played MTHL hockey in Toronto and had the eyes of the St. Catharines Black Hawks scouts on him as a Junior player.

Paul West as manager wanted to get involved with hockey so he joined up with Rick Facchini who he knew from work.

Coach Facchini says Paul will be back again this year to further develop his skills. Manager West is interested in taking several coaching

clinics and would like to coach at some level.

As a first year Tier 2 coach and manager, the duo wanted to thank the executive who helped them with a demanding schedule and ice time. The executive support plus the help from the parents were greatly appreciated by all on the team, coach Facchini says.

Receiving a new award from the Georgetown District Minor Hockey Association was long-time minor hockey executive supporter Bill Fisher.

Fisher took home a large trophy called the Joe Pentecost Memorial trophy. Pentecost was president of the GDMHA for two years and is credited by Tom Davidson as bringing in minor hockey to Georgetown as "we know it today."

"There isn't anything Bill

hasn't supervised in minor hockey," Davidson says. Fisher moved to Georgetown in the summer of 1959 and the same year he became involved in Legion hockey working with minor hockey players.

Since that time he has spent every winter working in minor hockey in some capacity, except for one year when he travelled to Edmonton for one year. In the early 1970s he was chairman of the Volunteer Recreation Com-

mittee of Georgetown which preceded the Recreation Dept.

Fisher has been on the minor hockey executive ever since 1965. He was also an assistant coach, coach and manager before he joined the

executive.

"The kids have done more for me than I'll ever do for them," Fisher says. A native of Winnipeg, Fisher played hockey there as a youngster before an eye injury sidelined him from the game.
