A HOME OF YOUR OWN

THREE-BEDROOM CONTEMPORARY DESIGN WITH FULL BASEMENT

This spacious two-story home design is perfectly suited to the medium fringed residential building lot. The plan provides for 1,400 square feet of finished floor area on its two levels; and the full basement encourages the development of additional accommodations and/or recreational facilities at a later date. The traditional exterior is finished in mixed brick veneer and stucco with a Dutch barn style roof, which could be finished in either shingles or more conventional shingles.

The elevated main entry takes the form of a small porch, which includes a weather-protected access from the double screened garage. This feature will be particularly appealing to homeowners who intend to build in areas which suffer extremes of weather. The entry leads into a compact reception foyer which contains a two-piece vanity bath and an entrance storage facility. From the foyer, traffic moves naturally into the L-shaped living/dining room combination. The living room features small-paneled formal windows for view and natural light. The dining area has a sliding glass wall through which views and access to the large rear-facing balcony, for outdoor dining in fine weather.

The well-planned U-shaped kitchen/dinette combination features a step-saving work triangle configuration, abundant cupboard storage and generous counter-top work surfaces. The dinette area could have either a dining table or built-in banquet-style seat furnishings. The spacious family room/denette which adjoins the kitchen-dinette features a recessed masonry fireplace and a second set of sliding glass doors leading onto the rear balcony.

The access stairways to the upper level and to the full basement are positioned in the hallway between the foyer and the kitchen-dinette area.

All three bedrooms are situated on the second level, as is the three-piece master bathroom. Each of the bedrooms has excellent closet storage facilities, good exposure for view, ventilation and natural light, and ease of access to the bathroom. The master bedroom has a pocket door access to the bathroom, enabling it to double as an ensuite facility.

Plans for design No. 82-1401 may be purchased either by the single set, at a cost of \$130.00 for the first set and \$25.00 for each additional set, or by the package. A pre-set plan package including the first set, is economically priced at \$185.00 and an eight-set package, also including the first set, is only \$225.00.
