The Junior Girls Cross Country Team has been one of the top teams in the province for the past four years. This team won six Invitational meets before capturing the Halton and Peel-Halton titles. Against the top 30 teams in the province, the girls won the silver medal, once again bringing honour to the Town of Halton Hills.

DOUG SMITH - Cross Country
 5th in Canada Games
 After winning the 800 metre race at the Halton, Peel-Halton and South Ontario Regionals, Doug placed a very strong fourth in the Senior Boys 800 metre at the High School Provincial Meet. He went on to win the 800 metre race at the Canada Games Trials in Ottawa, and later placed 5th in the Canada Games in August.

ERIC HOPKINS - Cross Country - 2nd in O.F.S.A.A.
 Eric showed his talent during the cross country season, placing 2nd at the Halton and Peel-Halton Cross Country Meets, running against 250 competitors. At the Ontario Championships in November, Eric won the silver medal in the Midget Boys category, emerging as one of the top young runners in the province.

Flag football cannot expand without referees

The Georgetown Flag Football league can't expand past their nine team league this season because there is a shortage of qualified referees, says president Martin Hardcastle.

The league expanded last year from eight teams to nine teams, but that number will stay static in 1982 because not enough referee candidates have come forward, Hardcastle says.

Problems arise with a lack of referees because the flag football league is becoming very competitive and it is often unfair to ask a fellow player to ref in a close game when no official is available, Hardcastle says.
 The flag football league is still looking for willing people to come forward as referees. They are also holding a referee clinic May 8 at 1:30 p.m. at Cedarvale for anyone who is interested.
 The opening schedule begins May 30 and all teams have started their training, he says. The signing deadline

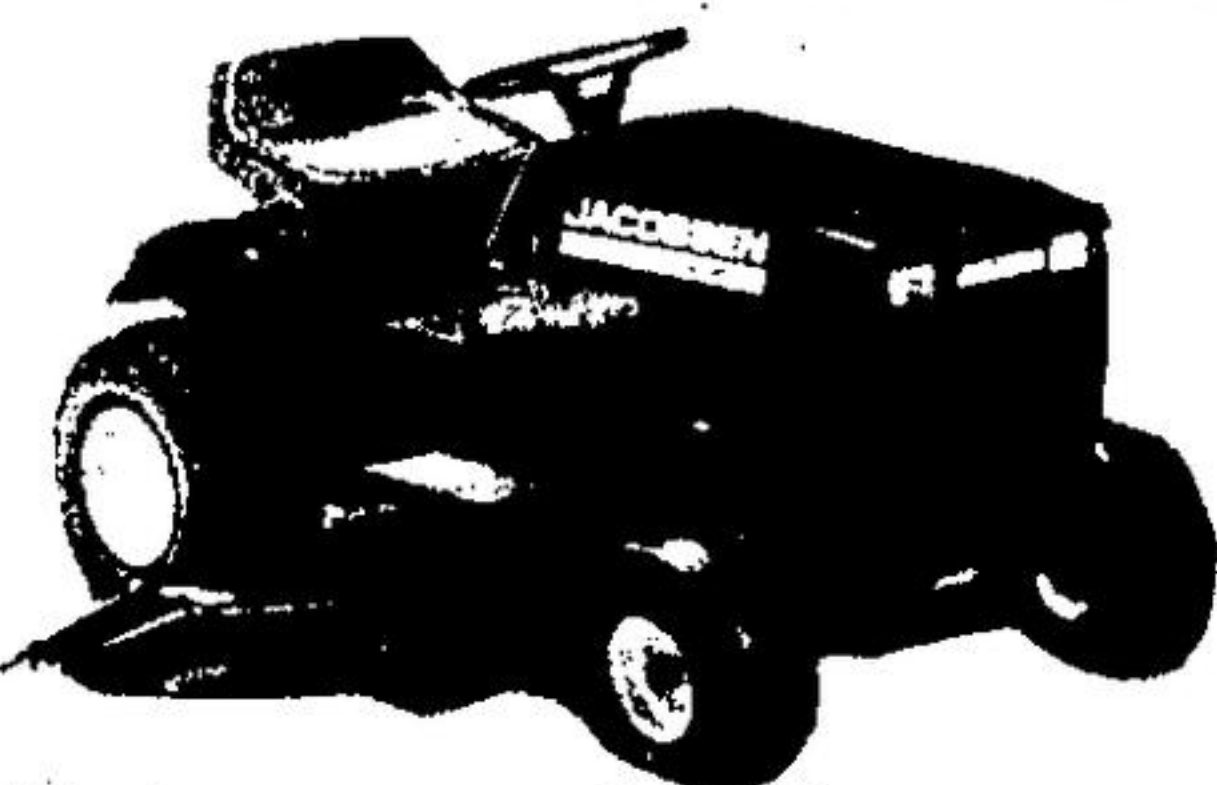
