DOUG GILLESPIE
1981 Canadian Open Midget Freestyle Wrestling

In his 5th year of wrestling, Doug competed in the Ontario Midget Wrestling Tournament where he placed 2nd. He then went on to the Canadian Championship in Cambridge where he received a Bronze Medal.

TIM DIXON
1981 Ontario Open Midget Freestyle Wrestling Championships - Bronze

In only 2 years of wrestling as a member of the G.D.H.S. Wrestling Team, Tim received a Bronze Medal at the Ontario Midget Wrestling Championships held in Cambridge. He has since represented Ontario at the Winter Games where he received a Gold Medal.

MIKE JACOBS
1981 Ontario Games for the Disabled - A Gold and 2 Bronze Medals

In only his first year of competition Mike did extremely well at the Regional Games for the Disabled in London. He received 2 Golds, 1 in the long jump and the other in weight lifting. He also received 2 Bronze Medals for his efforts in the 100 and 200 metre sprints.

Mike went on to the Ontario Games in Burlington where again he placed 1st in the running long jump and 3rd in the 200 and 100 metre sprints.

ERIC ELSON
1981 O.F.S.A.A. Swimming 4th in 100 M Freestyle and 1st in 100 Individual Medley - new record set 1:04:62

As a member of the G.D.H.S. Swim Team, Eric represented his team well in the 100 Individual Medley and the 100 Freestyle at both the Halton and Halton-Peel Championships. At the O.F.S.A.A. Meet held in March, Eric placed 4th in the 100 Freestyle and 1st in the 100 Individual Medley setting a new record of 1:04:62.

CHERYL THOMPSON
1981 O.F.S.A.A. Swimming 1st in the Senior Girls Individual Medley

1981 was a successful year for Cheryl as a member of the G.D.H.S. Swim Team. She competed at the Halton Championships in the Junior Girls 100 Metre Freestyle, 50 Metre Breaststroke and the 100 Metre Individual Medley. Cheryl received 3 firsts, and also set 2 new records. At the Halton-Peel Championships, Cheryl went on to receive 3 firsts in the same events and set 3 new records.

In March of '81 at the O.F.S.A.A. Championship Cheryl's dedication and hard work won her a first place in the Senior Girls Individual Medley.
