Jesus' gentle arm enfolds me.

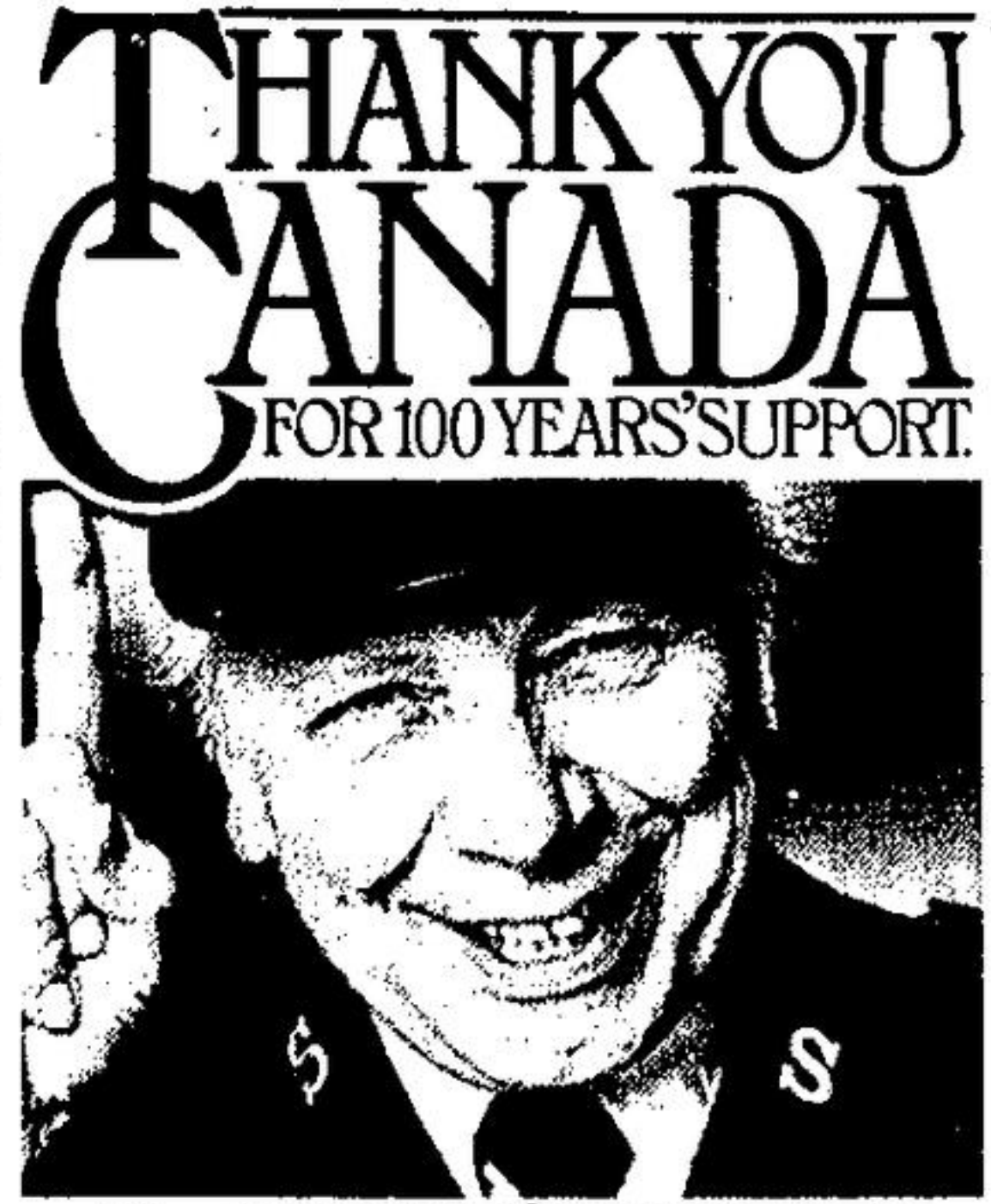
