Two new school records were established last weekend by Cara McGaw and Paul Burroughs. McGaw in placing fifth in the junior girls' javelin, set the new mark at 31.60 metres. Burroughs also set a new record in the javelin with his throw of 41.60 m which placed him ninth.

Long jumpers Lori DePaul and Brad Ferguson placed third in midget boys' and fifth in senior boys' respectively. Joanne Bingham jumped 1.49 m to place third in the midget girls' high jump event.

The open boys' distance medley team of Brad Ferguson, Chris Ferguson, Gary Hubbert and Doug Smith with a time of 8:15 ran to a fourth

place finish. Eighth place finishes were attained by the midget girls' 4 x 100 m and sprint medley relay teams.

The next meet for the Rebels will be the Father Redman Invitational track meet at York University on Friday and Saturday.
