Firsthand instruction is given in pond, stream, bird, pioneer and wildlife studies. Some of the more recreational activities include canoeing, swimming, hiking and orienteering.

The base camp for the Summer Resource Program is Mountbatten Wildlife Centre with extensive use of other areas including Kelso, Mount Nemo, Crawford Lake and Hillon Falls Conservation Areas.

Sessions start July 5 and are one or two weeks long at a cost of \$45 per week, family rate; first child is \$45 and second child is \$40.

An exciting event for area bridge players took place at the Georgetown Club last week when the area clubs sent one team each to play for the Credit Valley Bridge Association's "Duke Wilson Trophy".

Along with the regular game, the team-of-four players from Acton, Georgetown, Caledon, Orangeville and Brampton (3 teams) played against each other in a most friendly and cooperative game.

After the smoke had cleared, the Georgetown Team which was Duke Wilson, Mike Lorusso, Brian Ayer and Arthur Kwei were ahead of the field and won the honour of being the first team to take home the hardware.

Coupled with the Team of 4 game the regular "BIG" game with the "expert" board was played. The north-south winners on the board played a club partial and made eleven tricks. The east-west winners covered the north-south pairs into no trump and crushed them. This was the hand.

The Georgetown Bridge Club held their annual Team of Four Championship, a record turn-out of eighty-four bridge players.

This evening also was held in honor of Mr. Duke Wilson as he became eighty years young. The players honored Duke with their congratulations.

The Champions of the Team of Four Game were Arthur Kwei, Peter Gostovic, Brian Ayer and Lyanna Kwei scoring seventeen and a half points of a possible 24. The second place team consisting of Ed Hills, Ron Rochford, Cyril Cooper and Joe Maurer missed by a half a point providing an exciting battle to the end.

The third and fourth places were tied by the Christian-Young-Kakro-Planagan team and the Clarke, Mikkelsen, Kumar and Hannon team.

Next week the club will run two sections which will be a first for the club. The regular section will of course take place. In addition to this, the second section, an invitational game will decide the first ever winners of the Duke Wilson Trophy.

This trophy was donated by the area bridge club members to encourage social comradeship among the area clubs. The Credit Valley Bridge Association initiated this friendly competition.

Looks like most North-South pairs will end up in 2 clubs unless West balances with 2 hearts and pushes North into a safe 3 clubs or a highly risky 2 spades contract. Only an original spade or low trump lead will hold declarer to 10

tricks in the normal club partial. Hearts will play well for East-West pairs and the defence has to be careful to assure their six defensive tricks. Only a diamond from North before the second round of trumps is played sets up a third-round ruff for what should be a crucial under-trick. South is marked for some high card strength by his original response and North can tell from his hand and the dummy that it certainly isn't in the black suits. The pass of 2 clubs shows 3 or more clubs and fewer diamonds.

The north-south winners in the regular game were Bina Adams and Terry Hansford

followed by Rexene and Earl Heffren in second place. Third place went to Bernice Cote and Richard Raymond and fourth to Catherine Young and Lorena Norris. The East-West winners were John Flanagan and Peter Kakro followed by Roy Turtop and Peter Gostovic. Third place went to John and Denise Jansen and fourth to Art Norris and Gundy Klatsmacker. The Georgetown Bridge Club continues to extend the invitation to the area players to come and join the fun. A partner is guaranteed. And she's cute. The game is held at the Legion Hall on Tuesday evening. Game time is 7:45 sharp. Come and play bridge.

Halton Hills is increasing its municipal insurance coverage. The cost of insuring the administration and its property will rise from \$96,649 last year to \$86,963, although the town hopes to save \$2,700 on its coverage in the future. Liability coverage will increase this year, covering the town against claims of up to \$10 million in 1982, more than double the coverage last year. In a report from Glenn Magnuson Ltd., the Georgetown firm managing the town's policy held by Frank Cowan Company Ltd., committee members were informed that claims against municipalities have increased in size and frequency.
