Want a good spinner?

Want a good spinner? One that will not twist your line? Then you had better get yourself some Blue Fox spinners. These spinners have a built-in "anti-line twist" that runs the body of the lure in the opposite direction to the blade.

This little "gear" is inside the body of the lure and can be seen from the rear. This way there is no need for a swivel ahead of the spinner, and that much less terminal tackle to detract from the action of the spinner.

Blue Fox spinners come in a wide variety of sizes and colors, and some with various finished hooks. Try a few of the Blue Fox spinners this year, and let me know what you think of them.

Try to bring your new and effective tackle, and I don't think you will go wrong with these spinners.

RAINBOW AREAS

A lot of action has been had in the popular rainbow trout areas around Owen Sound. This has been a perfect spring for the trout as well as the walleye, and the result should be excellent in years to come.

Rains last week raised the water level and made upriver access easier for the migrating fish. We are actually in desperate need of rain, but too much at this time will wash out the newly laid spawn.

Splake have been showing up well in the creel counts, and many of them are large fish. Anyone interested in rainbow trout and the rainbow rivers should join the Ontario Steelheaders and Salmon Fishermen. Write box 497, Station D, Toronto, M6T 3K1.

A monthly newsletter will keep you up-to-date with the world of the steelheader. The OSSF is promoting the stocking of the Saugenee river and should direct their attention to other rivers as the Saugenee improves.

WALLEYE ACTION

Walleye action has already mentioned is hot, but where to go? Try the Moon River, in Woods Bay or Blackstone harbor in the Moon basin. The water level has been very high, from all the snow we had in that area last winter.

There is still a problem with Ontario Hydro in the Moon River, as they control the dam and the level of the river. They are more interested in hydro generation and anti-flood control so don't care about fish. There are answers but they don't want to hear them. Another hotspot for walleye is the Nottawasaga River.

Port Severn is always a popular spot with walleye fishermen, and any fast water location on the Trent Severn waterway should produce fish at this time of the year. There are any more locations of walleye fishing, but above all, check the fisher regulations or summary. There are LOTS of sanctuaries when it comes to walleye, and they are too many to mention here.

Pick your fishing spot, then check if it is a sanctuary. No matter where you fish old goldie, the excitement is high, even though the fight is not the best. Actually the walleye is an under-rated fish when it comes to fight. I have had lots of tussles with them and find them a great fish.

The Credit River is now hot. Fly fishermen are taking lots of native brookies in the upper reaches, and the Blue Winged Olive in size 16 or 18 are doing well. Personally I like the old standby, the Hares Ear in nymph or even a dry version. For the larger trout and the larger runs and deep pools, try a large brown stone fly nymph. Trout seem to recognize them as early available food and hit them with gusto.

For the hunter, the groundhog licence is waited for each spring. Another aspect of hunting in spring, is and should be the crow. These birds are increasing and are becoming a nuisance to farmers.

Almost any farmer will welcome you to hunt crows if you ask before hunting his property. Lots of action outdoors these days, and the weather makes anyone want to get out. Keep June 19th, the day before Father's day set aside. That is the date of the next "open house" with the location set at Zellers. Lots of action then, so don't miss it.

Colgate Women's Games in 5th year

The Colgate Women's Games will be making their fifth annual appearance on June 19-20, 1982 at Etobicoke's Centennial Stadium in Toronto.

All females ten years of age and over as of December 31, 1982 (that is, born in 1972 or earlier) are eligible to compete in the track and field competition.

Sponsored by Colgate-Palmolive Canada, the meet is the only one in Canada that does not require an entry fee.

The Colgate Women's Games have grown considerably since their inception in 1978 as a one day affair that attracted some 900 entries. In 1979 the meet was expanded to a two day event and the entries have since doubled with over 1800 entries received in 1981.

It is expected that the Games will once again see an increase in entries this year, thereby fulfilling Colgate's hopes of expansion of the

level of participation in track and field.

The event has become the largest female track and field meet in Canada. Although the majority of the entries in past years have come from within Ontario, entries have also been received from Quebec, the Maritimes and Western Canada. Both the United States and Bermuda have also been represented at the Colgate Women's Games.

Each female that competes in the Colgate Women's Games will be the recipient of a free T-shirt that will be provided by Pennman in their capacity as an official supplier of the Games.

For those fortunate enough to finish in the top three of their particular event, Colgate-Palmolive offers Grants-In-Aid of Education in varying amounts depending on the athlete's age category and overall placing. The philosophy of Colgate behind these awards, which

total over \$11,000, is to provide financial assistance to encourage young women to continue to expand their knowledge in the activity of their choice.

In addition, the top three athletes in each event will also receive a Colgate Women's Games medal, and all finalists will receive special awards.

Colgate's rationale behind sponsoring the Women's Games is quite simple: They believe that women have not been given the same opportunities as men to develop their athletic skills, and that since their prime target group is women, it is a way of thanking the consumers for supporting their products.

Reporting as Mistress of Ceremonies at the 1982 Colgate Women's Games will be Diane Konihowski, Canada's premier
