GDHS environment students join nationwide Pitch-in campaign

If you happen to see an army of young men and women trying to fill colorful garbage bags along the main thoroughfares of Georgetown Thursday and Friday, they aren't new town employees. They're Grade 10 environment students from Georgetown District High School taking part in the Pitch-In '82 campaign launched this spring by the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters in co-operation with Shell Canada Ltd. The May 10 to 16 campaign is endorsed and supported by the Ontario ministry of environment.

Together with teacher Bill O'Reilly, the students are taking a close look at what goes into their garbage bags. Their study will identify what kinds of wastes are being produced around town and what groups are spreading the garbage around. Then the students will consider how the litterers could be convinced to dispose of the garbage in proper containers.

In class, the young people are learning about the problems involved with solid waste disposal. At a grocery store earlier this week they took a look at product packaging to see if it was really

"We throw a lot of stuff away when really they could be done with biodegradable materials or reusable materials instead of creating extra waste," Mr. O'Reilly said. "Energy is being used, and
