

# Councillors' meeting with trustees open

A meeting May 25 among town councillors, chambers of commerce and the Halton board of education's finance committee will not take place behind closed doors.

Finance committee chairman Bill Priestner decided Wednesday morning to open the meeting to the press and public after a discussion with board chairman Len Auger.

The change comes quick on the heels of news that Oakville, Milton, Burlington, and Halton Hills have all passed the board's 1982 budget and will be collecting the board's dues from taxpayers.

The municipalities had hemmed and hawed about doing so. Mr. Priestner had earlier hinted that the meeting would not be opened to the public unless such action took place.

The meeting was set up to explain to these groups how the board arrived at its \$132 million budget for 1982, following complaints that 13.7 per cent increase is too much.

The board budget was passed March 18 and has sparked controversy among businessmen, taxpayers and elected officials.

The May 25 meeting takes place at 7:30 p.m. at the Halton board meeting room on Guelph Line in Burlington.

Mr. Priestner has said that he will be going through the same budget presentations, using the same overhead slides from the board's March meetings. Those meetings were open to the public, yet sparsely attended.

Negotiating over the budget will not take place, he has said.


