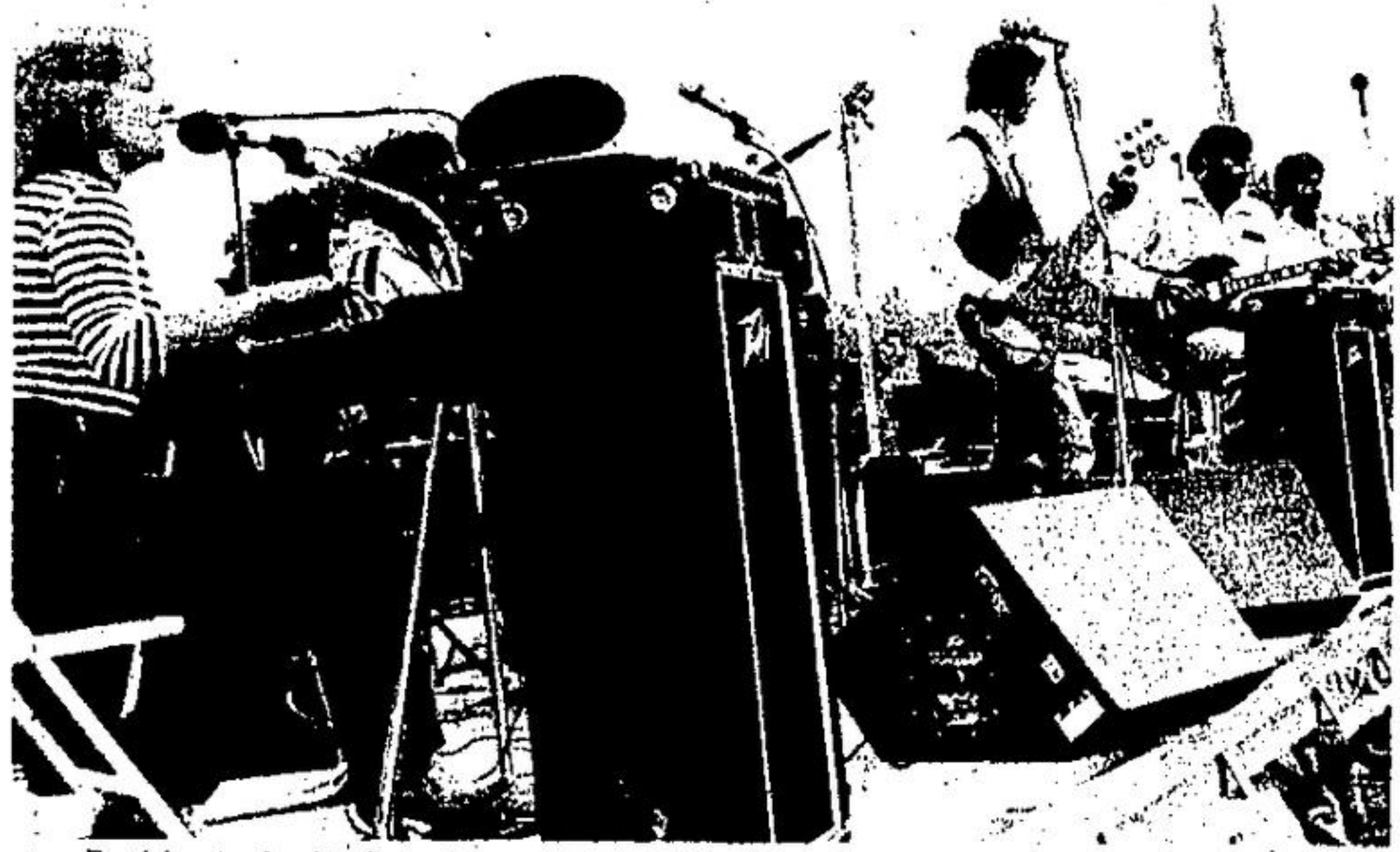


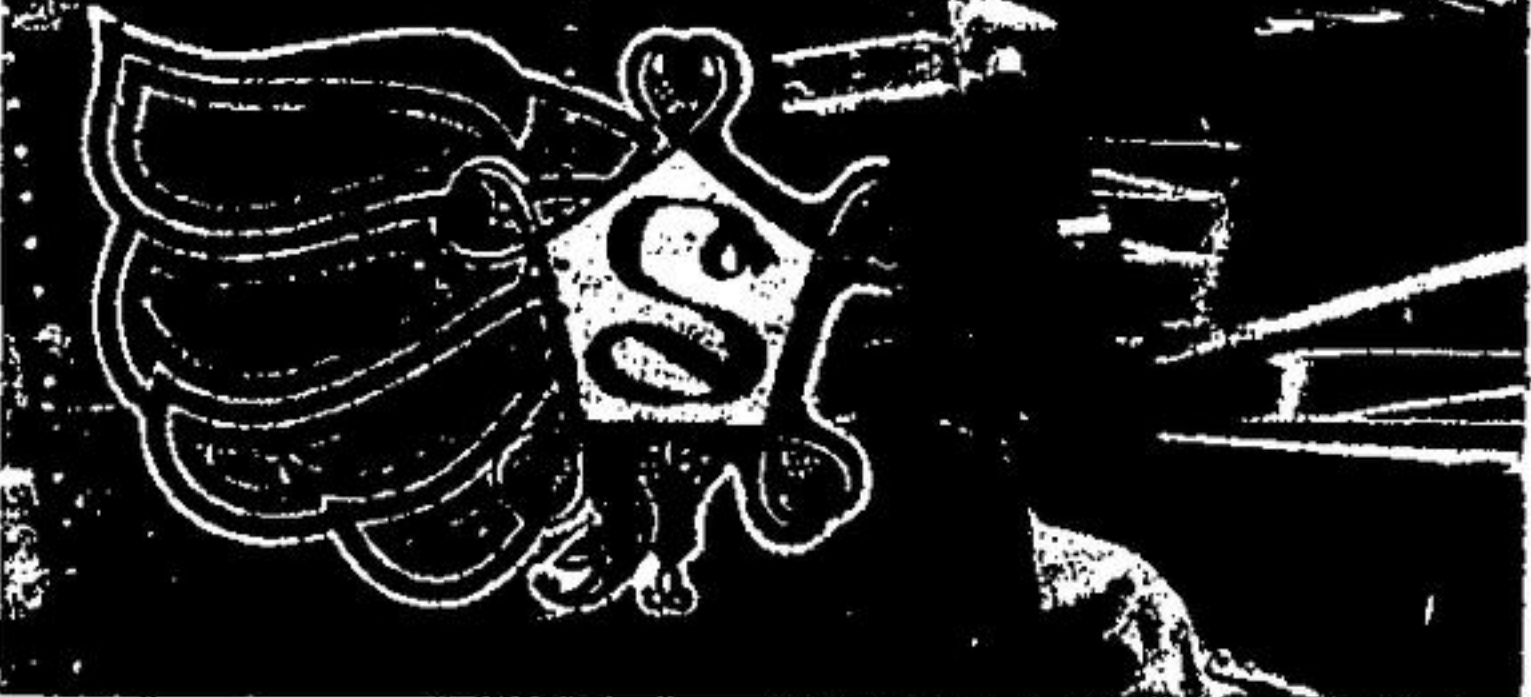
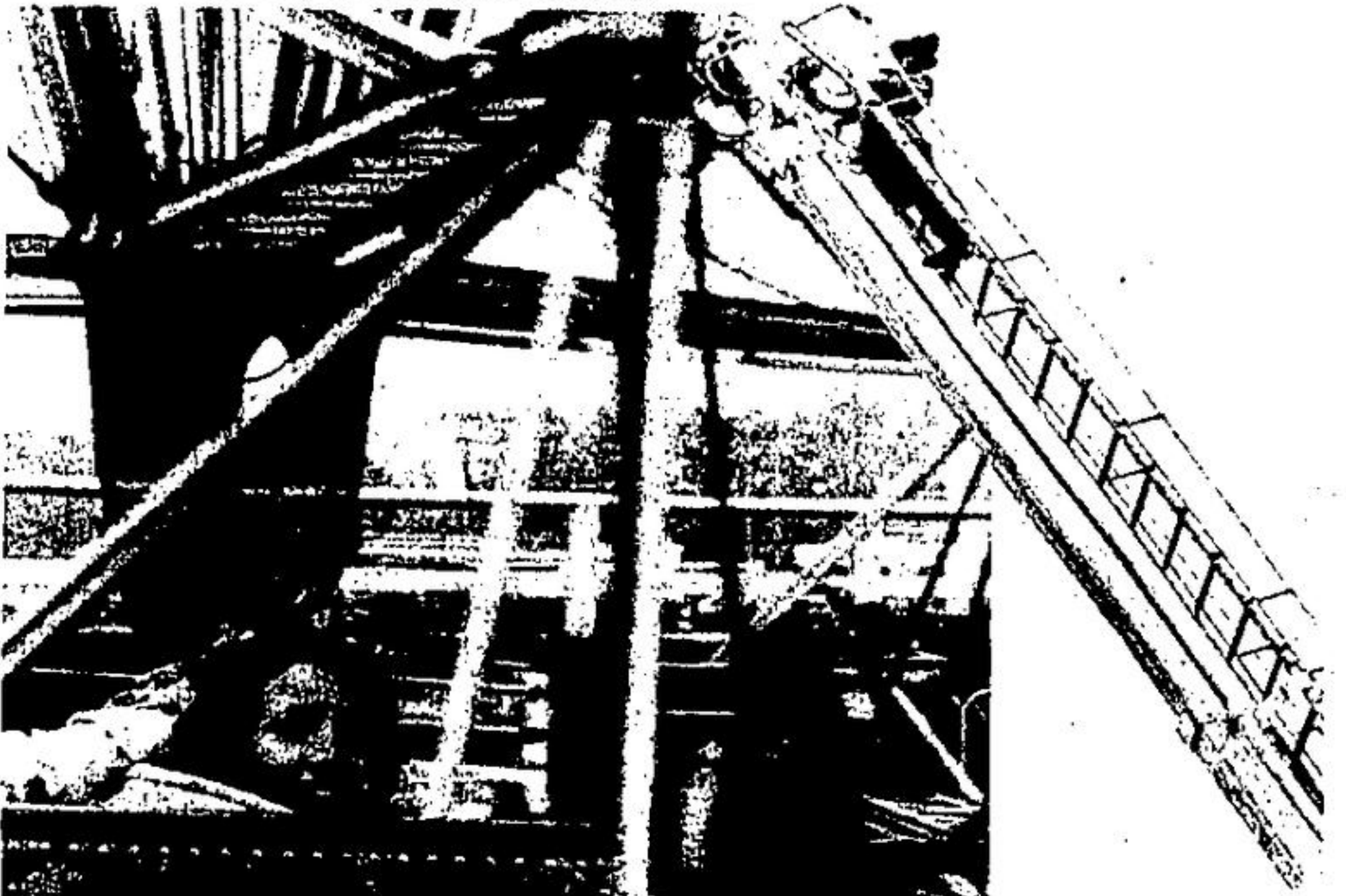
Bang-o-rama's color kaleidoscope
