The weekend is the national judging meet of the Historical Automobile Society of Canada which involves over 100 antique cars. The meet is a first class event with a number of activities taking place. All vehicles will register at the Museum Saturday. A 'fleamarket' will be held from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. where participants and the public can buy or trade parts. That afternoon will be a time for exploring for all vehicles and drivers, which will do a fast and slow tour of the Halton Region.

Sunday's events provide a perfect outing for the whole family to see the glamorous automobiles of the past. Over 100 cars will be judged in 14 classes from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Visitors can get involved in the judging by choosing their favorite vehicle for the People's Choice Trophy.

THREE BEDROOM DESIGN IS IDEAL SPLIT ENTRY FOR NARROW LOT

This compact split entry home design is perfectly suited to the narrow frontage urban residential building lot and provides in excess of 1,000 square feet of well-organized finished floor area, for present use, and nearly as great an amount of space, in potential, in the unfinished lower level. The mixed vertical and horizontal channel siding of the exterior, highlighted by the brick chimney and shake roof, serves to define the space, and provides a durable and easily-maintained facade. For those who prefer, the roof could be alternately finished in more conventional shingles.

The weather-sheltered main entry leads into a spacious reception foyer, from whence twin hall stairways lead up to the main living space and down to the unfinished lower level. The main landing contains the spacious outerwear storage facility, from whence traffic moves naturally to the left and into the commodious L-shape living-dining room combination. The living room features an elevated-hearth masonry fireplace and convenient log storage, for convivial "at-homes". The dining area is immediately accessible to the kitchen.

The well-planned U-shape kitchen has a step-saving work triangle configuration, abundant cupboard storage and generous countertop work surfaces.

All three bedrooms are positioned to the rear of the floor plan and well away from the main entertaining area for freedom from disturbance. Each has generous closet storage facilities and good exposure for view, ventilation and natural light. The spacious master bedroom has a walk-in closet and a two-piece ensuite bathroom.

The unfinished lower level features a roughed-in masonry fireplace and roughed-in plumbing for a three-piece bathroom as the bases of any future development. Here is abundant space for additional accommodations and/or recreation facilities.

Getting to know duplicate

The bridge player knows how to count points. He realizes that 15-17 points are necessary in the partnership to bid and make most any bid; that 18-20 are necessary for a two bid; that 21-24 are necessary for a 3 bid and that 25-27 are required for a four bid. This is the point count preference to play a suit contract in which ruffs can be utilized.

In order to play a no trump contract, the point range should increase by 2-3 points at every level. Perhaps one should keep the above bridge thoughts in the back of their mind to make sense of today's hand and the philosophy behind it. This was the hand:

TIE HAND:
 Bd 10
 Dir. E
 Vul - both

S - AK73
 H - K832
 D - 1083
 C - A6

If he does, and his bid is 1 H, North will have to pass; but if he opens 1 C, North can double. In the former case, after East passes, South should double and N-S will wind up in spades; in the latter case, South will respond to North's double with 2 NT, which may end the auction.

If West doesn't open, N-S bidding on their own, will end up in some number of no trump. Eight tricks are available in no trump for a plus 120. In diamonds, N-S can score ten tricks for plus 130 as long as declarer ruffs two clubs in dummy. The top score should go to those N-S pairs who play in a part score in spades, scoring nine tricks and a plus 140.

The North-South winners in this week's game held at the Georgetown Bridge Club were Brian Ayer and Arthur Kwei, the club's resident experts. Second place was won by Grant Real and Lois Harbour with third place

going to Helen Fleming and Phyllis Campbell. The East-West winners were Helen Hyde and George Sargent. John and Denise Jansen were second and Gus Flesch and Fred Allen third.

The Georgetown Bridge Club meets every Tuesday evening in the Legion Hall on Mill Street. Game time is 7:45 and a partner is available for those who require one. The club is air-conditioned, providing a comfortable evening. Come and play bridge.
