super meal, an entertaining cabaret, and then danced their way to the wee small hours!

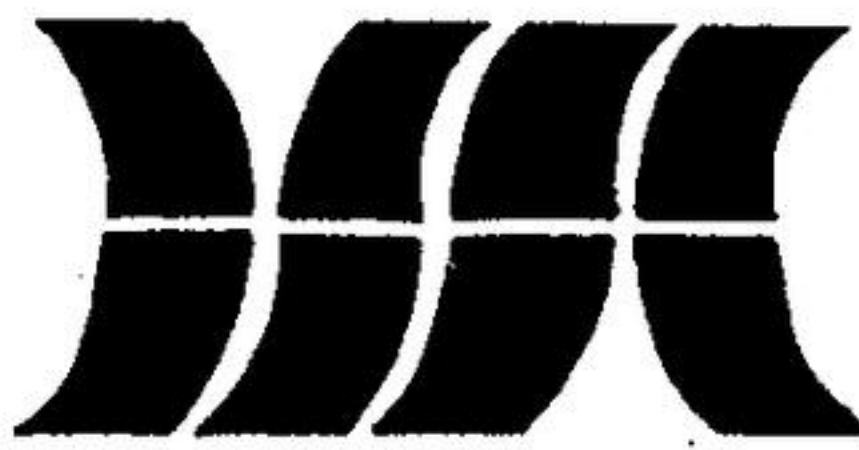
