Fawn almost falls victim to household predator

The balance of nature?

Dennis Fowler and son Cary of Halton Hills shared a heart-tugging experience with nature at their Sixth Line home last Tuesday when they spotted a large Labrador retriever trying to steal a fawn from its mother.

Cary, 16, had seen the doe pacing frantically in the bush behind their house and, keeping an eye on it with binoculars, discovered that the dog had the fawn in its jaws and was carrying it off.

Mr. Fowler and Cary chased the dog, finally prompting it to drop the fawn, the cries of which let them know it was not seriously injured. They carried the baby deer back toward the spot where its mother had been, but saw no sign of her. After waiting to see if she'd respond to its cries, Mr. Fowler called a local veterinarian for advice and was told it would be best not to try and care for the fawn in his home, but to leave it where it was.

Cary watched the fawn from a distance for more than two hours that evening before finally leaving it in the hope its mother would return. Apparently it did. The next morning, neither he nor his father could find the baby, but adult deer hoofprints indicated the doe had indeed returned for its fawn.

Mr. Fowler said he tried to trace the Labrador, believing it may belong to the owners of a nearby home, but no one was there at the time. It's not a vicious dog, he said, but often plays near their home with their own smaller-breed dog. Bearing no ill will toward the retriever, Mr. Fowler acknowledged that its attack on the fawn was a natural enough action, but pointed out that there are packs of wild dogs roaming the countryside which should be tracked and impounded. Such is the nature of rural life in a largely urban municipality, he agreed.

Recreation department offers fun

The Halton Hills Recreation Department is offering an exciting variety of programs for children this summer.

The Tot Lot program is back with a site at Joseph Gibbons School in Georgetown and one at Knox Presbyterian Church in Acton. Children three to five years old will have the opportunity to experience fun with crafts, music, games and more!

Sports Camp will be held during the month of July for one-week sessions at the High Schools in Acton and Georgetown. Children aged seven years and over are encouraged to register in this program which offers basic skill instruction in a variety of sports and includes swimming as an added feature.

Camp Prospect is once again offered to children aged seven to twelve years. This program in-

cludes sleepovers, archery, canoeing, orienteering and much more! Children register for two week sessions for this camp which takes place at Prospect Park, Acton. Bus service is available at an additional cost.

The Playmobile is a travelling activity centre which visits rural sites weekly. If you live in Glen Williams, Norval, Ballinafad, Limehouse, Speyside or Hornby, this is the program for your children aged five years and over. Games, sports and crafts are included in this program.

The Regional Municipality of Halton PUBLIC NOTICE
DISPOSAL OF UREA FORMALDEHYDE FOAM INSULATION (UFFI)
Halton Regional Council has approved that owners of homes in Halton will not have to bear the cost of using the Region's Sanitary Landfill Sites for the disposal of urea formaldehyde foam insulation (UFFI).
The Region has Sanitary Landfill Sites at:
a) The Fourth Line, in Oakville, 1.25 km. north of Highway 5, and,
b) The Highway 403 North Service Road just west of King Road in Burlington.
Those who wish to use one of the Landfill Sites for UFFI disposal must notify in writing the Regional Public Works Department office in advance. The landfilling fees for disposal of the UFFI material will first be charged at the Landfill Site and then rebated to those homeowners who produce acceptable evidence in the form of a statement, from the person or company who hauled the material to the Landfill Site, setting out the name of the hauler and the source and weight of the material, and the date on which it was taken to the Landfill Site.
The District Industrial Abatement Section of the Ministry of the Environment has confirmed that the landfilling of UFFI material will not create any increased environmental risk.

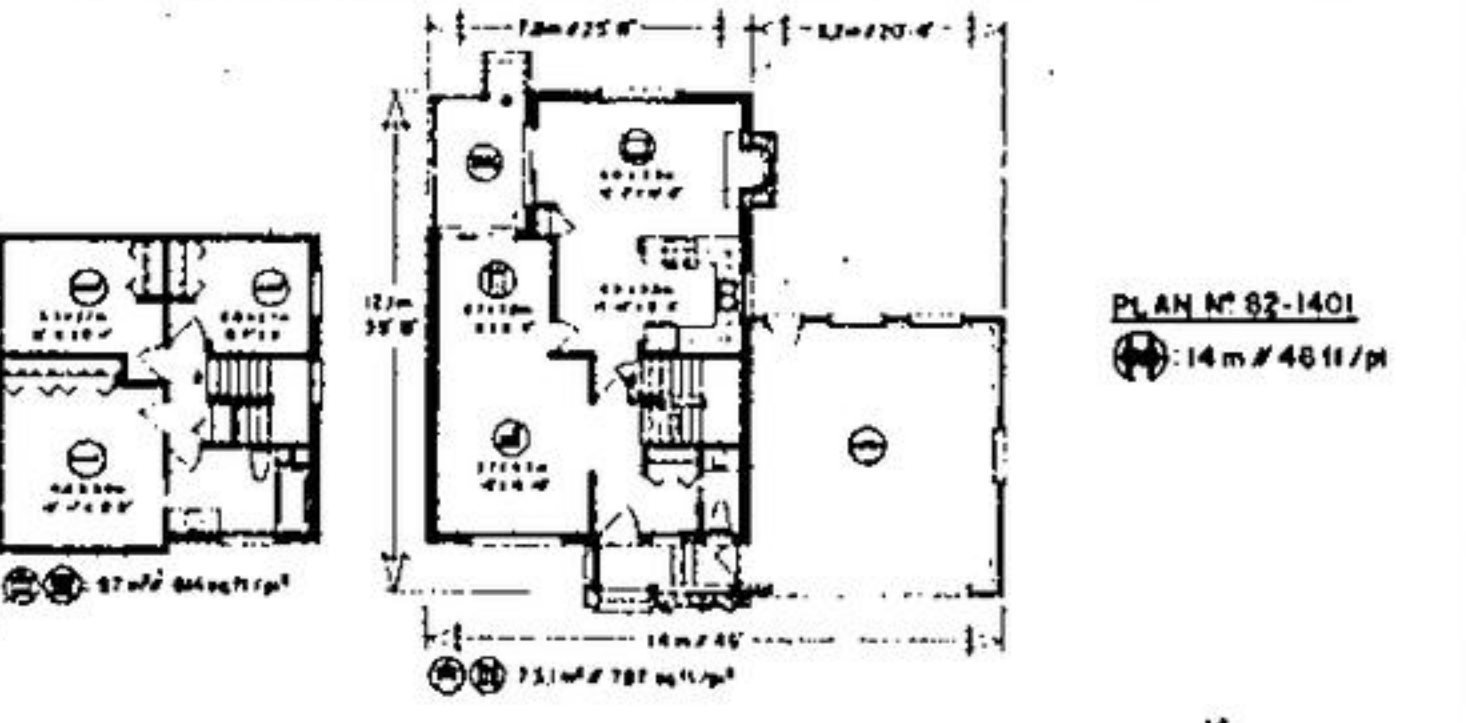

THREE-BEDROOM CONTEMPORARY DESIGN WITH FULL BASEMENT

This spacious two-storey home design is perfectly suited to the medium frontage residential building lot. The plan provides for 1,400 square feet of finished floor area on its two levels; and the full basement encourages the development of additional accommodations and/or recreational facilities at a later date. The traditional exterior is finished in mixed brick veneer and stucco; with a Dutch barn style roof, which could be finished in either shakes or more conventional shingles. The elevated main entry takes the form of a small porch, which includes a weather-protected access from the double enclosed garage. This feature will be particularly appealing to homeowners who intend to build in areas which suffer extremes of weather. The entry leads into a compact reception foyer which contains a two-piece vanity bath and an outdoor storage facility. From the foyer traffic moves naturally left into the L-shape living-dining room combination. The living room features a large-format window for view and natural light. The dining area has a sliding glass walk-through which provides easy access to the large rear-facing balcony, for outdoor dining in fine weather. The well-planned U-shape kitchen-dinette combination features a step-saving work triangle configuration, abundant cupboard storage and generous countertop work surfaces. The dinette area could have either a dining suite or built-in banquette-style nook furnishings. The spacious family room/lounge which adjoins the kitchen-dinette features a raised-hearth masonry fireplace and a second set of sliding glass doors leading onto the rear balcony. The access stairways to the upper level and to the full basement are positioned in the hallway between the foyer and the kitchen-dinette area. All three bedrooms are situated on the second level, as is the three-piece master bathroom. Each of the bedrooms has excellent closet storage facilities, good exposure for view, ventilation and natural light, and ease of access to the bathroom. The master bedroom has a pocket door access to the bathroom, enabling it to double as an ensuite facility. Plans for design No. 82-1401 may be purchased either by the single set, at a cost of \$130.00 for the first set and \$25.00 for each additional set, or by the package.
