Construction adds new 'jogs' to four-year old event

## Mayor's Race route changed

Construction on one leg of the Halton Hills Mayor's Race route has forced the town's recreation department to make a few sudden race changes, some of which will actually enhance the run scheduled for June 13 in Georgetown.

The new route, which is expected to be confirmed next week, is shortened to 5 kilometers (or from 5.5 kilometers to a standard 10 for long distance marathoners). Changes were made yesterday (Thursday) when a runner trying out the old course notified the rec department of a major construction problem along the path which veers east from Sinclair Avenue and leads to Armstrong

Avenue. A new route will have runners continuing up Sinclair Avenue to Armstrong Avenue, running west on Armstrong, turning left on Mountainview Road North to Todd Road and then along Todd to the Economy Forms Corporation plant. Runners will circle the plant, eventually returning to Todd Road where they will continue to Sinclair Avenue, turn right to Guelph Street and head for the race start - finish at the Gordon Alcott Arena.

The rec department hopes to add one final "jog" to the race route, directing runners behind the Halton Hills (Miracle Mart) plaza and round to the arena entrance. Further details about the

new route will be available in next week's Herald.

Meanwhile, everyone is encouraged to come out and run. If you register today (Friday), you'll save \$2. The rec department suggests that

runners can add more challenge to the race by competing against other companies, sports teams or friends.

There will be raffles for running shoes, (sponsored by North Halton Sports) and stylish race

T-Shirts will also be available. After the race, runners and non-runners are invited to stay for breakfast upstairs at the arena.

If you don't want to participate, come out and cheer the runners on. For

more information about the race, contact the rec department at 877-5185, extension 19 or 60. The department's offices are located on James Street, Georgetown and the Murray Memorial building in Acton.

## North Halton golf tips

As everyone is well aware, missing a golf shot is extremely frustrating. The shot which is most common among beginners and high handicaps is the one where the club strikes the top of the ball.

Of course everyone is an expert in this area. The common expression is "Oh, I lifted my head" or "I took my eyes off the ball". Wrong!!!

There is no one who will ever close their eyes while swinging the club or look up into the sky while making the picture perfect golfshot.

The problem lies in body awareness. What does your body do once the golf club is set in motion? In the case of our classic top shot, the body changes from its position at address to either a more upright position as the club is being taken away from the ball or as the club is being taken into the downswing.

In other words, the body has lifted as the club is being taken back and through.

To check your position, stand in front of a full length mirror. Place yourself into the correct address position. Then watch yourself swing back and through and observe whether or not the body position changes a great deal during both the backswing and forward swing.

Remember, the ball and the target do not move. You move, therefore you must begin to listen to yourself and be more aware of your body positions before, during and after the golf swing.
