

Armed Forces' top Central Band 'best entertainment ever' - Aird

Ontario Lt. Gov. John Black Aird spoke for the enthusiasm of town residents Saturday when the Central Band of the Canadian Armed Forces made its last stop in a five-day area tour at the Acton arena.

Mr. Aird said in thanking the band that he was not supposed to make comparisons, but in this case he would. "I have never been more entertained than I have been here tonight," he said.

About 700 people attended the concert production, and although there was plenty of room for many more, the evening was still a success with numerous standing ovations to the band, conducted by Major Derek Stunard.

Jack Carpenter of Acton, a Kitchener radio station musical host, was made an honorary band sergeant for his contributions with the band during its five concerts.

Mr. Carpenter amused the audience by acting as announcer (horse race style) when the band did a musical sweepstakes number.

The armed forces band was in Acton as a last stop to a five-day tour sponsored by members of the Masonic Lodge.

The Lodge will use money raised in the concerts to invest for a hearing program, Hearing for Every Living Person (HELP). Last year

Masonic lodges raised \$90,000 for the charity.

In addition to evening concerts in Kitchener, London, Hamilton, Guelph and Acton, the band gave special free concerts for school children in matinee performances.

Featured Saturday was a tribute to the Big Band era with numbers from the stage band - The Ambassadors, and the vocal group - The Diplomats.

Mr. Carpenter, the host at all concerts is native to the Acton area, and is a past master of the Acton Masonic Lodge, the Walker Lodge, No. 321. He is known as the radio personality of the Music Hall variety radio program, aired on CFCA-FM Sunday evenings.

The Acton Legion hosted a banquet for the armed forces band prior to the concert.

Dignitaries attending the evening included the Deputy Grand Master for the Grand Lodge of Ontario, Dr. Ron Grashaw, associate conductor for the armed forces band, Captain Ron McCallum, Ontario Legion president Dave Capperault, District Deputy Master James Cooper, Acton Legion president James Higgins, Walker Lodge Worshipful Master Jack Tatton, and Halton Hills Mayor Pete Pomeroy, who presented a certificate of appreciation to the band.
