DO YOU QUALIFY?

Upgrade your fences and outbuildings this year and generate local employment with help from a Farmstead Improvement Grant worth up to \$2000.

Ontario will pay half the cost of eligible improvements (\$2000 maximum grant per farming operation).

ELIGIBILITY
You're eligible if the value of your farm production is at least \$12,000 or if you own and farm a minimum of 40 hectares (100 acres). Eligible improvements include:
• new and replacement wire fencing
• outbuildings improvements
(painting, roofing, siding, foundations)
• removal of derelict buildings



All improvements must be done by local labour or contractors and materials purchased before the end of 1982.

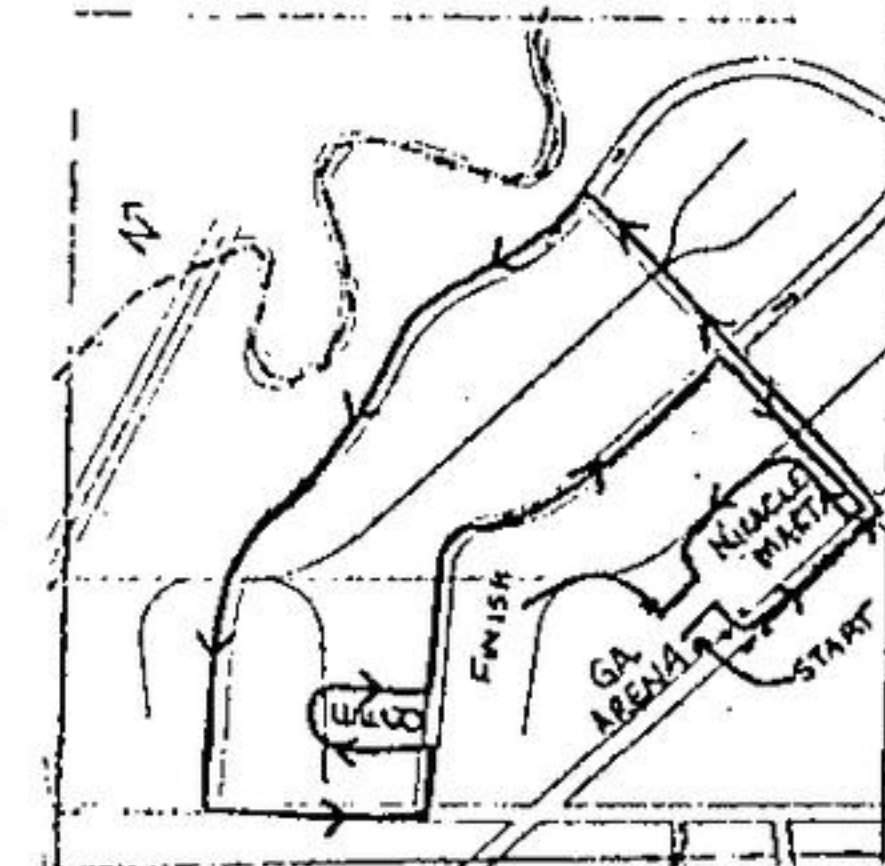
