## Two different religions

How should religious be compared to each other? I am not talking about various Christian denominations (Lutheran, Baptist, Roman Catholic, etc.) but about different religious altogether (Christianity, Hindulsm, Islam, etc.). Perhaps the best starting point is to ask what the different religions believe about God (Who? What? How many? etc.). It should be clear that the worship of a different god means a different religion.

Christians worship the Triume God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost. There are three persons but only one divine being. That is what the Bible teaches. All Christian creeds and doctrinal statements say the same thing about the one true God. Christians have always agreed that those who do not worship the Triune God are not Christians but belong to a different religion, worshipping a false

god (see John 5:23). It is simply recognizing facts to admit that Hindus, Muslims, Jews, Buddhists, Sikhs, etc. are not Christians. It is not unkind to say so. It is simply true. The recent controversy about the Jehovah's Witnesses involves the same issue. They emphatically reject the Trinity. They are not of the Christian religion. They claim that they are right and Christians are wrong. By doing so, they show again that they are of a different religion.

This is important now because there is another non-Christian religion moving aggressively In Georgetown. I am speaking about Mormonism. There are so many differences between Mormonism and Christianity that one hardly knows where to begin. But everyone should know this: Mormons do not worship the Triune God. They say that the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost are three different, separate gods. They also say that there are more gods than these three. So they are not monotheists, believing that there is only one true God. They are polytheists, believing in many gods.

If any Mormon missionaries come to your door, they may talk differently at first. But if you question them, they will admit that they believe in several gods. Scholars have documented this fact thoroughly. I suggest especially Irvine Robertson, What the Cults Believe (Moody Press), and Walter R. Martin, The Kingdom of the Cults (Bethany Fellowship, Inc.).

The purpose of this article is simply to inform people. It is a well-documented fact that Mormonism and Christianity are two different religions. Christians need to know that in order to speak intelligently with Mormons.


