Intercounty soccer conduct problems

Discipline, or rather the lack of it, rears its ugly head this week. One Inter County league player was suspended for six games and another for four games following violent conduct on the field. An appeal has been lodged with the league on behalf of one of the players and will be heard in the course of the June league meeting.

League president Haddy Smedema is disturbed at the situation in general and is determined to stamp out unruly behavior. One of last week's games was a nightmare. Official cautions (yellow cards) were issued and five players were ordered off the field (red cards).

This case will be dealt with by the disciplinary committee tomorrow evening. A club official receiving an ejection was given a reprimand and three games are to be replayed, one at the expense of the offending club. This after only two weeks.

Inter County results: Division One: Mariners 3 Meteors 2; Meteor B 5 ICCM 4; Acton 1 SWM 0. ICCM lead the division with four points and a two goal advantage over the Mariners. Eagles and Acton follow with three points each. Both Meteor teams have two points and SWM prop up the division yet to net a point.

Interestingly enough SWM have the second best defensive record with only four goals lost. Division Two results: Ajax 4 Brackens 0; Vikings 3 MFM 1; Falcons 1 Butcher 5; and the Pineview Rangers vs MFM result is not known yet. Butcher and Acton are atop the division with full points from three games (six), and Ajax are third with four. Brackens and Vikings have two points. Falcons, Pineview and MFM have yet to gain a point.

It was Les Tinsley's turn to join the own goal club of the Mariners last Wednesday. Fortunately the lads did just enough to deserve the win over Meteor Blues in a well contested match.

Archie Tannock netted the hat trick to pace the victory with Ian Syme countering for Meteors. Meteor Whites pulled off a surprise win over ICCM and almost blew it. Leading 5-2 with 15 minutes left to play ICCM got back in the game scoring from two penalty kicks.
