

Casting nearly over David Lowe shooting second film

The spotlights will be hot June 21 when Georgetown's David Lowe begins shooting his second film.

David, 18, is a first-year photographic arts student at Ryerson Polytechnical Institute in Toronto and he's raised \$1,000 from individual donations toward this film.

Auditions were held for eight teenage and ten adult roles May 15 and 16 and David says casting is about 90 per cent completed.

The script, written by Georgetown's Andy Wodhams, is a contemporary original drama containing Canadian symbolism.

To fit in with full-time jobs, shooting, which will run until July 24, will be done weekends and evenings during the week.

Producer Robert Turner, also a Georgetown District High School graduate, said most of the filming will be done in local homes, with one evening's shooting at Georgetown District Hospital and one day at the John Elliott Theatre.

The final production will be a half-hour Super 8 film. David had to cut the time from the original one hour because of funding difficulties.

Ease up, trustees tell Stephenson

Minister of education Bette Stephenson is being asked to help bear the extra tax burden levied by the May 13 Ontario budget by increasing the 1982 grants per pupil to Ontario school boards.

Trustees at the Halton board of Education voted Thursday night to request an increase in the amount the provincial ministry pays toward education. The ministry pays \$2,493 per elementary pupil and \$3,221 per secondary pupil.

For the first time the Halton board exceeded ministry ceilings this year by \$49 per elementary pupil and \$234 per secondary pupil. The excess cost is paid for entirely by taxpayers through the municipal levy. All but one Ontario school board has been over ministry ceilings for years.

"In accordance with ministry requirements, our 1982 budget was established and approved by the board in March, 1982. The local mill rates required to produce a balanced budget have also been set by our municipalities. The net re-

sult is that our board is now faced with a built in deficit for 1982 of \$356,000 and no access to offsetting revenues," wrote board chairman Len Auger on behalf of trustees to Dr. Stephenson.

"We feel confident that had the treasurer's announcement been known prior to the general legislative grants being established, the effect of this increased expenditure would have been reflected in the 1982 'ceilings,'" the letter stated.

Increases in the per pupil amounts given boards will assist in offsetting the negative effect of the seven per cent tax being imposed on school supplies previously exempt. Notebooks, pencils, paper, art, physical education, science, music and technical supplies are now being taxed as are materials for equipment and building repairs.

CVCA's floodplain maps ready

The Credit Valley Conservation Authority has recently completed new floodplain mapping for several watercourses in the Credit River watershed. The Authority will be holding public information centres in the near future to provide the public with an opportunity to view these new maps prior to their official adoption.

The new floodplain

mapping covers the Credit River from Port Credit to the Credit Forks, Carolyn Creek, Silver Creek, Black Creek, Sunnyside Creek, Sheridan Creek, Sawmill Creek and Glen Erin Brook.

It is the function of the Authority to protect the mutual needs of both landowners and watercourses. To fulfill this obligation, it uses floodplain mapping to regulate development in flood risk areas.

Floodplain maps are large scale topographic maps of the river valleys which show the areas that would be inundated by a regional flood. The flood for the Credit River is the flood that would result from a storm equivalent in size to Hurricane Hazel if it were centred directly over the watershed.

Floods are naturally occurring events that may result from rapid spring runoff or severe summer storms. Building in areas that are susceptible to flooding will not only result in the risk of loss of life and extensive property

damage but could also increase flooding on adjacent property by restricting the passage of flood waters.

This new floodplain mapping will improve the Authority's ability to protect the interests of all watershed residents. The Authority invites the public to attend one of the following information centres to see the maps and learn about its watershed management programs.
