Halton golf tips

In the last few weeks we have been practicing our alignment, checking our grip and allowing our body to swing freely.

But, we still find that the ball is travelling off line. Or is it? Understanding ball flight will help us understand what path the club is travelling on, and, the angle of the golf clubs as it travels down the target line.

As has been suggested in the past few articles, always have a target to aim at. While we are practising place two clubs down on the ground, one arriving at the intended target, the other will be placed on a line parallel to the target line (that is the line the body should be placed on).

As we hit each shot notice (1) where did the ball start in relation to the target and (2) which way did the ball travel as it got further away from you. Example: a tree has been set as the target, as you strike the ball the ball starts left of the target line that indicates the path of the golf club.

The ball begins to travel right as it nears its target, this will indicate the angle of the club face at
