Our 'A' team tastes first league loss

Georgetown A cricket team tasted its first defeat for the season at the hands of Mississauga A in a league game played on Sunday at Jack Darling Memorial Park, Mississauga.

Weather conditions were very unsatisfactory as the Georgetown batsmen had to bat through the rain at times, and on a rain affected wicket which seriously restricted their stroke making.

On the other hand Mississauga started their innings on a dry pitch and in beautiful sunshine and G. Edwards and N. Kossoon, two left-handed batsmen, made full use of these conditions.

Both of them were given chances early in their innings, and Edwards in particular, went on to punish the bowlers by hitting four sixes and three fours during his stay at the wicket. He was eventually caught by S. Jahoor off Windsor's bowling for 77 runs.

N. Kisson, the only other batsman to make a respectable total also hit one six and a four in his score of 19. No other Mississauga batsman reached double figures and they were all out for 152 runs.

The Georgetown bowling was steady and A. Windsor bowled three wickets for 37 runs. K. Ramnarine captured three for 33 and I. Singh three for 28.

When Georgetown took their turn at the wicket, weather conditions began

to change rapidly. The sky became overcast, and soon afterwards, thunder and lightning made it extremely difficult for the batsmen to concentrate.

FIRST THREE
The first three batsmen, R. Mongru, S. Jahoor, N. Balkisson were out for 17 runs and B. Ramrattan and A. Singh came together to prevent a total collapse.

They were scoring freely until a heavy shower of rain came down and caused all the players to scamper for shelter. This delay lasted for about a half an hour but when play was resumed, both batsmen had lost their concentration and got out trying to force the scoring rate.

A. Singh was caught at mid-wicket in attempting a big hit for a well played 32 runs which included three fours while B. Ramrattan was bowled for 12. This partnership took the score from 17 for three to 64 runs when both batsmen were out.

From this stage it was an uphill struggle as the remaining batsmen fell cheaply and in quick succession for a total score of 80 runs, thus losing by 72 runs. H. Omardeen bowled three wickets for 21 runs while D. Kisson captured two for six runs.

Georgetown A will play the next game on Sunday, June 27 at Stewarttown against Hamilton A, the 1981 League champions while the B team will play against Welland-Niagara on Saturday at the same venue.
