Mike Doucette shares the spotlight with Jon Cornwell

Georgetown's dirt-trackers racked up another success at the weekly race meeting at Welland County Speedway.

Jon Cornwell, making his second appearance there this season, won both expert classes while Mike Doucette upheld his growing reputation as a hot-shoe rookie by again winning the junior class with insulating ease.

Cornwell, forced to take a week off from the U.S. National Championship series to do some major rehabilitation work on his Harley Davidson 750, rode his 500 and 250 class machines at Welland to test some recent development work done on both motors.

"We put a new cam in the 500 and although I rode it here last weekend the track conditions were so unusual we couldn't really judge how the motor was working. I've only ridden the 250 once before in competition and we're still playing with the set-up."

"I'll be riding both these bikes in the U.S. nationals toward the end of July and we want to be sure we've got the bugs ironed out before then."

During practice Cornwell took a bad spill on the Champion-Bel-Ray sponsored 500. With several people prying and hammering in the pits the "Wrecking Crew" managed to get the forks straightened sufficiently to put the bike back on the track.

Cornwell sailed through the night's races nailing down first place on the 250 with a substantial lead and then in the 500 class also leading from the first lap to the last.

Mike Doucette's win followed his usual pattern, first off the line with no serious challenges throughout the race.

Georgetown's other riders suffered a variety of problems: Steve Duff, still working out the bugs on his new Husqvarna, sheered a swing-arm bolt; Dave Broomhead fought his way to the final via the semi's, got a good start in the final but finished just out of the money and John Biersteker, making a rare appearance in the final line-up came a cropper in spectacular fashion half-way through his race.

Cornwell travels to the Indiana state fair grounds for the holiday weekend to take a shot at the Indy Mile round of the U.S. Nationals. "I really love riding the miles - it's a beautiful sensation - but everything on the machine is stretched to the limit - these motors were never designed originally to put out that kind of horsepower or rev that high."

"That's why we've pulled everything down and are rebuilding it from the cases up. Sometimes I think you need a degree in wizardry - plus a pot of gold to play in this game."
