Many people read their horoscopes in the daily newspapers to find out whether love will bloom, whether grandfather will be alright or whether their boat will come in that day. But anyone who's read about astrology as an exacting science knows that newspaper horoscopes are far too generalized and simplistic to be of any consistent benefit.

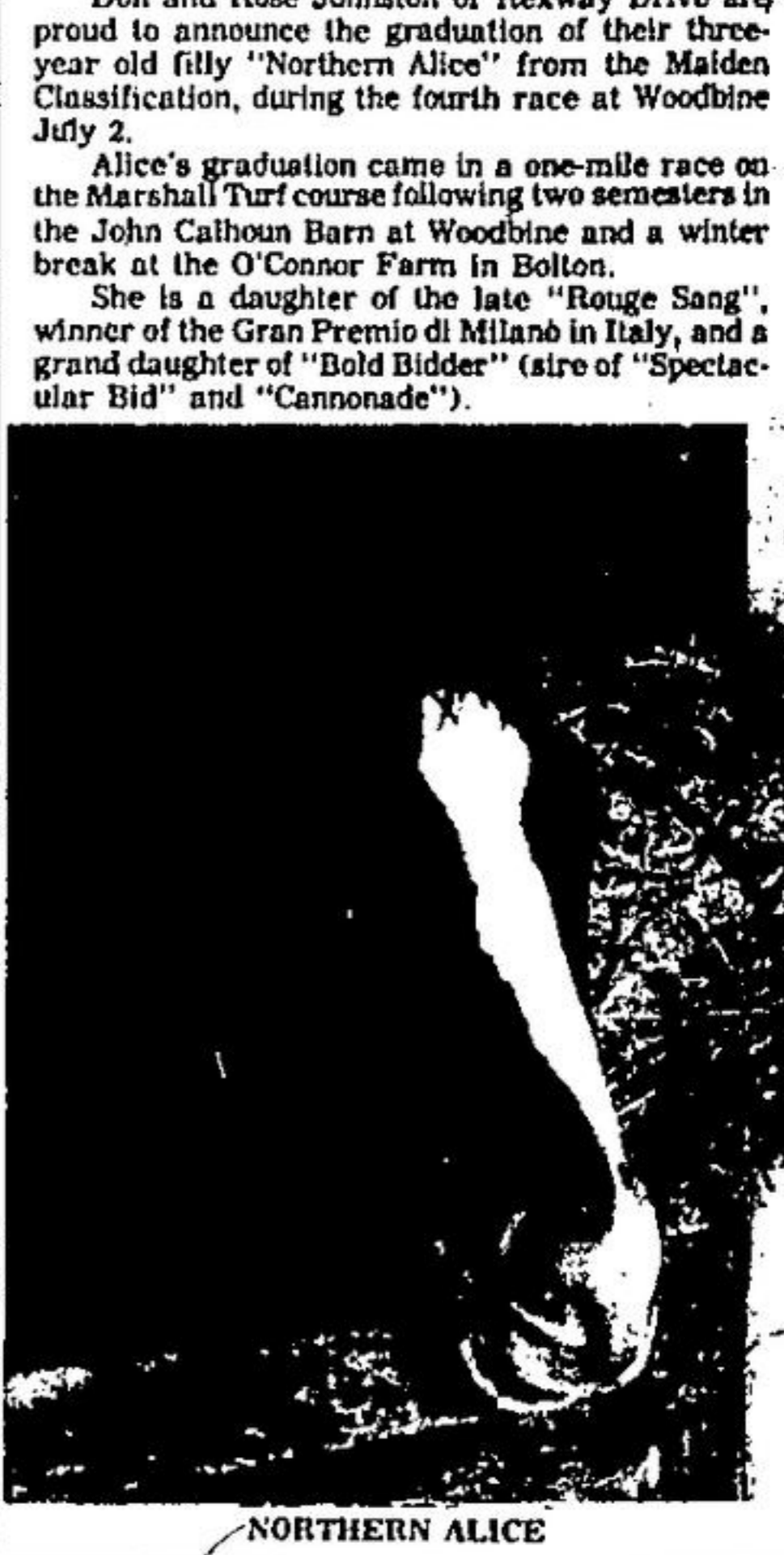
