## Bullfrog season starts later this summer

Yes, it is true; there is a season and other regulations dealing with bullfrogs. The Ministry of Natural Resources sent out a news release in regards to changes, and it was dated June 29, 1982, and I received it on July 5.

The "hunting" or taking season for bullfrogs WAS July 1st, and is now set at July 21st. They may not be taken before that date and the season runs until Oct. 15th. You also need a licence (no charge) and the daily and possession bag limit is 15 frogs.

A size restriction has also been introduced in Lanark and Ottawa-Carleton. So now you know: one more step in regulating and helping our natural resources. Please obey these new regulations and encourage others to do likewise.

Lots to do for the outdoors minded person or family. Bass fishing has been good to excellent in some areas and poor to rotten in others. But that is the way with fishing. The summer heat has affected trout fishing, but if you know of a cold spring, then the trout will be there and active.

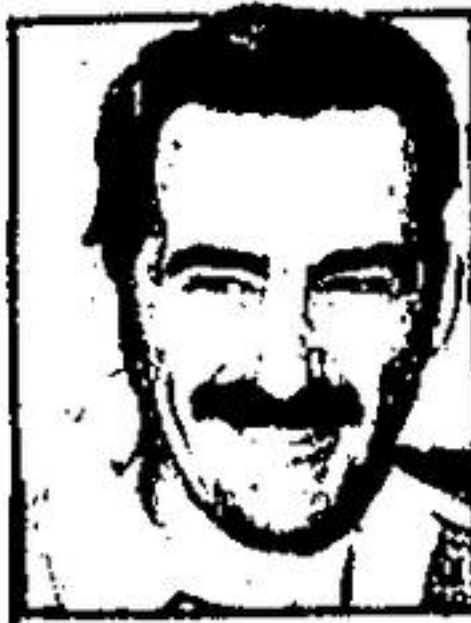
Two friends of mine spent the day close to Georgetown and caught 20 bass between them, taking a couple home for supper. All on "oil colored" plastic worms. Great fishing.
