Dig begins for Iroquois village

Crawford Lake gem

Herald Special Fundraising for the Crawford Lake Indian Village received a major boost recently with a \$10,000 donation from Ford of Canada.

The donation now brings fundraising efforts, launched with the opening of the 310-acre Crawford Lake conservation area in May 2, to \$70,000. 10 percent of the campaign's \$700,000 goal.

The newest conservation area in the Halton Region Conservation Authority, Crawford Lake is located near the corner of Guelph Line and Steeles Avenue in Milton. The area's "gem" is a meromictic lake—a deep body of water in which sediments at the lake's bottom are so well preserved (from the cold and lack of oxygen) that they provide an accurate natural history of the area.

Seeds and pollen have been uncovered from the lake's sediments which indicate that an Indian village was established on its shores over 500 years ago.

Funds raised from the current Crawford Lake campaign will be used to reconstruct the village and build an interpretive centre to provide information on the Indian culture that lived in the area. The centre will also provide information about the lake itself, the Niagara Escarpment, botany and biology.

Firefighter rescues boy in Credit River mishap

A 14-year-old Centennial Public School student was saved from drowning by a Georgetown volunteer firefighter Saturday.

Lance Reid of Maple Avenue was swimming below the paper mill dam, when his leg got caught in branches looped under the water surface. Spun around by the powerful force of water while still caught, he told friends with him to get help because he couldn't get out by himself.

After falling to save the youth by extending a stick to him, Lance's friends hollered for help, attracting the attention of Wade

Emmerson, 20, of Lorne Street who was passing above the dam on the bridge.

"At first I thought they were joking around, then I realized they were serious," Wade said.

After jumping from the bridge into the water about 40 feet below, Wade said he failed to pull Lance from the current and hold him up out of the water.

Lance eventually floated out of the current but he was unconscious. Pulled on shore, Wade's cousin, Tim Hills, applied mouth-to-mouth resuscitation to revive him.

"He's a lucky kid and I don't think he's going to be going down there again," Wade said.

He said he doesn't remember Wade swimming to him, but recalls coming to on the shore.

"It's dangerous below the dam by the new fish ladders," Wade said. "There's a lot of water going through there."

"I was in there a lot last year and the water was only a couple of inches over my head. This year the current is stronger and the water is higher," he added.

CVCA responds

An open fishway has been blamed for the strong current below the paper mill dam by the Credit Valley Conservation Authority's water resources manager. Don Teft told The Herald that debris has jammed the fishway and the Authority hasn't the right equipment to correct the situation. Made aware of the near drowning that took place by the fish ladders Saturday, Mr. Teft said the Authority was concerned about the danger and would get the fishway fixed immediately.

TWO-STORY TRADITIONAL WITH FULL BASEMENT

This three-bedroom, two-storey home design has the external appearance of a long-established country estate. The wide, rustic porch, stone veneer finish and upper-level dormers combine to lend an air of permanence, tradition and rural elegance. The design provides in excess of 1,900 square feet of finished floor area, for present use, and contains a further space of nearly 400 square feet of unfinished studio/lounge area above the double enclosed garage, for future development.

The veranda-sheltered main entry leads into a spacious and open reception foyer and outerwear storage area, from which traffic moves naturally to the right and down two risers into the sunken rectangular living room. The living room features a centrally-positioned, raised-hearth masonry fireplace and wide, sliding glass doors providing access to the rear patio. In typical country-style, the formal dining room separates from the combination kitchen-dinette via convenient pocket door, for ease of access when serving formal dinners and excellent separation of formal and informal dining styles.

The well-organized U-shape kitchen-dinette combination provides a step-saving work triangle, generous countertop work surfaces and abundant cupboard storage. The separate dinette area features wide sliding glass doors which provide access to the spacious rear patio, for outdoor dining in fine weather.

The stairway to the full basement is accessible from the side of the dinette area. A two-piece vanity bathroom and laundry-utility area are concealed behind a pocket door connecting to the kitchen. The utility area has also access to the garage, enabling it to function as a convenient mud room.

All three bedrooms are positioned on the second level, accessible via stairway from the main entrance foyer. Each has excellent exposure for view, ventilation and natural light; and each has generous closet storage. The spacious master bedroom has a full walk-in closet and a three-piece ensuite bathroom concealed behind a convenient pocket door.

Plans for design No. 77-1909 may be purchased either by the single set, at a cost of \$130.00 for the first set and \$25.00 for each additional set, or by the package. A five-set plan package, including the first set, is economically priced at \$185.00 and an eight-set package, also including the first set, is only \$225.00.
