CAS gets extra \$400,000

Haltos Children's Aid Society (CAS) and the province's ministry of community and social services ended ongoing budget negotiations last week, with the ministry granting the CAS an extra \$400,000 above the originally planned \$2.8 million budget for 1982.

In a press release issued after negotiations ended last week, Haltos CAS executive director Ron Coupland said the additional funds will end the Society's "perennial problem of reviews and arbitrations in order to get our fair share".

"We haven't received all that we need, but the additional money has certainly taken the edge off the problem," he added. CAS administrators have long complained that the province hasn't provided enough money

for child welfare in Halton, ignoring the fact that the region's demand for services continually outstrips what the Society's budget has been able to handle in the past without slipping into deficit financing.

Halton region provided 20 per cent of the CAS budget this year, just under \$650,800 and, as councillors considered

the CAS's problems dealing with the ministry, firmly supported the Society's bid for more funds. CAS board of directors president John Graham said that the Society has "been travelling through a tunnel of financial difficulties for four years."

"With this additional money, we can finally see our way clear to operating responsibly and yet

live within the fiscal restraints placed on the ministry," he noted.

The additional money brings the CAS budget to about \$12,000 less than what the directors had hoped for earlier in the year.

CAS officials have predicted that child abuse cases will also increase this year by as much as 20 per cent.
