## Mayor says utility renegeing on commitment to town

# Milton appeals decision

The prospect of a new Ontario Hydro 500 kilovolt transmission corridor through Milton has forced council to cabinet for a reversal of a Consolidated Hearings Board decision on a major Hydro project. Milton council decided Monday to appeal the decision before an Aug. 10 deadline to ensure that any new towers required for such a corridor remain within two existing 500 KV rights-of-way.

There are fears that a new line, mandated by a board decision to refuse a

Hydro-preferred route south of London and Brantford, will be built near Highway 401. The board wants an improvement of distribution in the Milton area studied.

Hydro spokesman Morris Hewitt told council that he could not guarantee that the new line would not follow the highway route rather than the route for which Hydro already has much of the right of way.

The two existing Hydro high voltage corridors distribute power on the Nanticoke-to-Pickering grid and the Bruce-to-Milton

power grid. Milton is appealing for three reasons:

— The town believes that expansion of existing corridors or additions to the new ones would have negative impacts on "environmentally sensitive lands near the Niagara Escarpment."

— New corridors would also take up valuable agricultural land.

— Mayor Gordon Krantz believes that any new corridors would be contrary to Ontario Hydro's commitments to Milton that there would be no addi-

onal facilities or corridors to those approved based on the Solandt Commission and the Bruce-to-Milton corridor studies.

Mayor Krantz repeated the reason that Milton did not attend the hearing board's meetings at Stratford was because Milton had been given assurances Hydro's proposed line would not come near Milton.

However, the hearing board did not accept Ontario Hydro's choice of route. The board modified Hydro's third choice and

brought the line into Milton.

During a special meeting of Ontario Hydro, Milton, Halton Hills, and Halton region representatives last week Hewitt could not say whether the utility told the hearing board of its commitment to Milton.
