New rules in force

Several important facts were firmed up at the monthly meeting of the Central Ontario Junior League held last Wednesday, July 14 in the O.H.A. offices in Weston. Attending for the Georgetown GEMINI were President, Bob McCandless Sr., General Manager, Bob Webster; and Bob Tost.

First: Both Brampton and Dixie have dropped from the league. Brampton has apparently folded completely whereas Howard Pallett, the Dixie owner, sent a letter apologizing for stalling so long and asking that the League proceed without Dixie for this one year. The League now consists of nine teams; Acton, Barrie, Burlington, Georgetown, Milton, Oakville, Thornhill, Streetsville and Richmond Hill; with eight to make the play-offs.

Every team will play a 40 game schedule. It is assumed, although not confirmed by the O.H.A. yet, that the players from last years Brampton and Dixie teams will be free agents and can go to any team as a 'non import'.

Second: The Central League has agreed to play a home and home exhibition series with the Buffalo Junior Sabres. The points from these games will not count in our League standings but will be compiled separately and the top four teams will play off for an

international trophy at year end. This is particularly important to any player hoping for a U.S. college scholarship since the Junior Sabres as 1981-82 champions are highly scouted by many schools. One representative from Buffalo, at the meeting, was their contact man, Jim Duke who lived for eight years in Georgetown.

Third: Miracle Marts will again sponsor an Ontario Junior 'B' All-Star Tournament during the Christmas break. The winner this year will receive assistance to go on to an all Canada tourney. Players this year will be based on a three star selection every game of the regular schedule. Managers will pick the three stars of the opposing teams and a 3-2-1 point system used. The top twelve players, at Christmas, will be automatically on the All-Stars. The coach will then add eight more players, however, he must select so that every team in our League has one representative. This tournament is probably the best opportunity for Junior 'B' players in Ontario to show their talents to scouts from 'A' teams and colleges. With the assurance that every team must have a player on the Miracle Mart All-Stars literally every player on a good or bad team has a chance of being chosen.
