This ruling entails the removal of one hand from the current round to be played at the end of the

This first ruling does not in any way affect the score of this pair at this time as bridge players realize that problem hands requiring much thought do occur from time to time.

If, however, this same pair continue to play slowly and fall behind again, the director will now award an average plus score to the opposition of this pair as he removes another board. Remember; in a duplicate game, should a pair slow you up, call the director for protection

South will be most surprised when the bidding gets to him after W-1C, N-Pass, E-IS. There is really not too much action. South can take even though he has the best hand at the table.

West can solve his rebid problem either by an underbid of 2C or an overbid of 3C. His hand is not nearly strong enough for a reverse. The underbid is the best action since it allows the partnership the chance of finding a heart fit if one exists.

However, this minimal

action does allow North. who did not bid the first time because of the uninvorable vulnerability, a second chance to enter the auction. A2D bid at this stage would show insufficient values to enter the first time, but a good suit (North might also have made a preemptive jump overcall the first time.

Most auctions will end with E-W in 4C making.

Car gets graded


