The young woman is the owner of the new ice cream shop in Glen Willlams called Scoops.

Serving up 29 flavors of the popular summertime treat, Barb opened up the business May 24.

It started off slow, but keeps getting better," she sald of her business.

Although she hasn't paid herself any salary yet, Barb said pretty well everything else is paid for.

Major expenses for the business are hydro and rent. Taxes, advertising, insurance and cleaning materials are additional expenses. Barb said her older brother Larry, 26, kave her a financial boost to start her off.

CAR SHOP Located in an older building painted white with green trim, near the corner of Prince and Main Strets in the Glen and across from Nature's Emporium, Scoops was formerly a customized car and van parts shop operated by Barb's brother Jack,

The specialty performance shop was closed down and carpentry work by Jack and his dad, and redecorating by Barb, renovated the building into an ice cream shop.

"I wanted a full-time job for the summer and couldn't find one," Barb said. Having worked parttime at Preston's grocery store in the Glen, she knew she enjoyed working with local people.

farmers and their nonfarm rural residents might follow to avoid confrontations about loose dogs, farm machinery noise and even odors. **RURAL AREAS**

In its policies for the rural area, the plan has added a new concern, rural clusters, again following the region's official plan. Unlike hamlets, of which there are only three in Halton Hills --Norval, Stewarttown and Glen Williams - rural clusters like Hornby and Limehouse are smaller gatherings of houses with some commercial operatlons. There are guidelines for development in these areas which differ from development in other parts of town.

The plan which, prior to last Wednesday's meeting, had been reviewed by the public at Stewarttown and Acton, is expected to face some opposition from residents with major land interests in town and even other land-use governing agencies, like the Credit Valley Conservation Authority.

HAZARD LAND There is disagreement between the town and the Authority over the designation of hazard lands in parts of Halton Hills (hazard lands being those particularly sensitive to erosion and flooding). The Authority is expected to review its hazard land position, consultant Peter Walker told his audience last Wednesday, and this designation in the Georgetown urban area will likely shrink rather than grow.

Meanwhile, developer Al Pilutti is concerned that a slice of land he wants to develop into rural estate homes on the Sixth Line has been left out of the new plan. However, he maintains, councillors have, agreed "in principal" to the pro-

Mr. Walker argued that Mr. Pilutti's development "didn't pass the first hurdle" to have it considered even though the proposal is several years old. It conflicts with the regional plan, he sald, because it is a rural estate project on the fringe of the Georgetown

urban area. WATER SERVICE in addition, a suggestion that water services cross the urban boundary into the rural area also contravenes the regional

plan. Builder and realtor Harold Fobert was also · surprised · to find that some property he owns

and has just recently developed does not conform with the new plan. His Knollcrest Properties at the southwest corner of Delrex Boulevard and Highway 7 has been designated "highway commercial", preferred for motels, car dealerships, service stations and even

building supply outlets. But Knollerest, which was approved under the former town of Georgetown official plan, contains a convenience store, Fobert's real estate offices and a dry cleaning outlet, as well as space for automotive repairs. Mr. Fobert was advised to put his grievance in writing to the planners.


