Steven Molody, 16 and James Lewis, 22, are expected to appear in Milton Provincial Court Aug. 9 to face theft and traffic-related charges (!led against them by Halton regional police and Guelph OPP.

The two were arrested following a high speed chase early last Friday

morning which began near Erin and ended at the Steeles Avenue-Sixth Line intersection in Halton Hills.

Mr. Molody also faces criminal negligence charges for allegedly trying to run down one OPP constable and trying to shove another's cruiser off the road during the chase.
