HISTORY OF BRANCH 120

As is the case in all new groups, funds, or rather the lack of funds, was a serious matter, and many were the schemes proposed to raise money. Garden parties were arranged, entertainments were held as well as card parties, and even a film (the old timer "Dawn")

was sponsored in an attempt to keep solvent.

Members seem to have taken their duties to the parent body seriously and sent delegates to all Provincial and Dominion conventions. They became active in support of a drive then being held for a new post office in Georgetown which finally resulted many years later in the erection of the present building. Many will recall

the Legion's first auditor, Mr. Wilson, manager of the Bank of Montreal.

Sept. 13, 1928, another important event took place when it was moved that the formation of a W.A. be approved and that the ladies be given all possible assistance. With the first Nov. 11 approaching, the entire executive acted also as a Poppy Committee. Mayor LeRoy Dale attended this meeting and congratulated members on their progress and offered any help he could. Very appropriately, 25

Living without compromise

At a time when there seems to be more and more proliferation of values that are contrary to the Gospel, the pressure on people to conform to these values appears to be ever increasing. The end result of succumbing to such pressure is, of course, inevitable - messed-up people.

The gradual but consistent erosion of the Judeo-Christian value system is fairly evident in our present-day Canadian society.

To be or not to be Christian is the question that more and more people are being pressured into asking themselves in the face of such chaotic times - times when respect for human life has been devalued even more than the Canadian dollar; marriage and family life are being attacked from all sides; a sense of Christian morality is being mocked as being "old-fashioned" and unrealistic.

The challenge of being Christian is the challenge to be fully human and fully alive. Cultural Christianity in our times is not sufficient to survive the pressures of anti-Christian values that crowd in upon us on all sides.

What is required is for Christians of all denominations to renew their faith in Jesus Christ and be prepared to live the Gospel without compromise and once again discover that we can change the face of the earth!

In the scriptures we read (1 Peter 5:7-11): "Be calm but vigilant, because your enemy the devil is prowling round like a roaring lion, looking for someone to devour. Stand up to him, strong in the faith and in the knowledge that your brothers and sisters all over the world are suffering the same things".
