The Halton Region Conservation Authority is taking applications for its Farm Tree Replacement Program, primarily dealgued to assist rural landowners with a minimum of acres in replacing the once plentiful elm trees lost through the Dutch elm disease with suitable alternatives.

With a minimum order of 25 and a maximum of 100 trees, the Authority will plant six to ten foot trees at a nominal cost. Applicants can choose from Sugar and Silver Maple, white and Mountain' Ash and Carolina Poplar, Deadline for applications is Oct. 15.

All applications will be reviewed and an Aughority staff member will inspect the site before plant-


